**SUPERIOR CHARTER TOWNSHIP BOARD
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1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Superior Charter Township Board was called to order by the Supervisor Kenneth Schwartz at 7:00 p.m. on June 20, 2016, at the Superior Township Hall, 3040 North Prospect, Ypsilanti, Michigan.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Supervisor Schwartz led the assembly in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

3. ROLL CALL

The members present were Ken Schwartz, David Phillips, Nancy Caviston, Brenda McKinney, Rodrick Green, Lisa Lewis and Alex Williams.

4. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

It was moved by McKinney seconded by Green adopt the agenda as presented.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

A. REGULAR MEETING OF MAY 16, 2016

It was moved by Green, seconded by Lewis, to approve the minutes of the regular Board meeting of May 16, 2016, as presented.

The motion carried by a unanimous voice vote.

6. CITIZEN PARTICIPATION

A. CITIZEN COMMENTS

Kathleen Hubbs, N. Kenwyck, said that the same builders of the original Bromley Park Condos are going to finish building the two four-plexes in the condos. She said they original buildings they built have numerous problems, including leaking basements and drainage problems. She requested the Township make sure the new units are constructed properly.

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Bill Secrest, Cherry Hill Road, said that the Southeast Michigan Land Conservancy (SLMC) was formed 25 years ago and they and other groups in the township have been very successful in preserving property in the township. There are about 2,500 acres preserved. The SLMC along with the Superior Land Preservation Society and the Township are sponsoring a 25 year celebration on July 9, 1 PM to 5 PM at the Township Hall. There will be food, music, special guests and more.

7. PRESENTATIONS

A. MARY ZUCCHERO, ANN ARBOR AREA CONVENTION AND VISITOR BUREAU

Mary Zucchero of the Ann Arbor Area Convention and Visitors Bureau (AAACVB) made a presentation to the Board about the AAACVB. The AAACVB works to bring more meetings, events and visitors to Washtenaw County. Their board includes 24 members with representation from almost every community in Washtenaw County. AAACVB has a Community Tourism Action Plan (CTAP) grant program, which awards up to \$10,000 for every community and require a 20% match. Superior Township was awarded the grant for way-finding signs and landscaping in the hamlet of Dixboro.

B. VALBRIDGE PROPERTY ADVISORS, MARKET STUDY

Nick Groves of Valbridge explained the market study that his firm completed at the request of the Township for use in reviewing the Sutton Ridge- Redwood Area Plan Amendment. The study included six areas sites and almost 100 sales records. Mr. Groves said they samples were of similar homes and neighborhoods as the area around the proposed Sutton Ridge-Redwood site but they were not able to find an exact "nested community" for comparison.

Residents of the area had numerous questions and concerns about the study, i.e.: there was not data, the sample did not include a nested community, the study samples were different than the Sutton Ridge development and area, the study did not include statistical analysis of a scientific nature (mean, mode, median, etc.), the summary did not indicate a positive outcome for communities near apartment complexes. Mr. Groves indicated that in order to respond to all of the resident's concerns, it would take a much more involved and expensive study. The conclusion of the study was indicated on page 19: "Based on the empirical data collected and analyzed, there is no evidence that leased fee ownership of medium and high density residential properties positively or negatively affects the prices of neighboring single family residences."

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8. REPORTS

A. SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Schwartz reported on the following: 1. Standard and Poor recently completed a review of the Township's bond rating. It remained rated at AA due to good economy, strong budgetary performance and good liability controls. The rating on the YCUA/Superior Townships Sanitary Sewer bond was downgraded to AA- due to indicators related to Ypsilanti Township. Superior Townships bond rating is comparable to any community in Washtenaw County and would help to secure bonds at a low interest rate. 2. Hyundai filed an with the Michigan Tax Commission that their building and property is over assessed. They are seeking a significant reduction. Their IFT tax abatement ends in 2017. 3. DTE will be providing an estimate for adding street lights along MacArthur Boulevard. Supervisor Schwartz will have more information at the July board meeting. 4. Supervisor Schwartz and Dave Phillips met with residents of Timberwood Court, Tanglewood subdivision and a representative of the Washtenaw County Road Commission to discuss the residents petitioning to establish a special assessment district to repair the roads. The cost for Timberwood is around \$100,000 and the cost for Tanglewood is about \$550,000. This would be the first SAD for road repair in the Township and it is expected that the Township would contribute a percentage of the total cost. 5. Township officials will be meeting with a potential purchaser of Danbury Manor Apartments. They have requested information on the PILOT and other issues. 6. The Dixboro Farmers market is open every Friday evening and has been very successful. 7. The courts off of Vorhies were seal-coated. 8. There is a home on Panama that will be listed on the County tax sale. Supervisor Schwartz recommended that the Township purchase the property and sell it to Habitat for Humanity.

B. DEPARTMENT REPORTS: BUILDING DEPARTMENT, FIRE DEPARTMENT, ORDINANCE OFFICER REPORT, PARK COMMISSION MINUTES, SHERIFF'S REPORT

It was moved by McKinney, seconded by Lewis, that the Superior Township Board receive all reports.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

C. FINANCIAL REPORTS ALL FUNDS PERIOD ENDING APRIL 30, 2016

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Board members discussed the various revenues and expenditures for the first quarter. Some of the salaries, supervisor, accounting, assessing, treasurer and fire department are at 30-34%. Some activities are above budget, i.e.: roads, professional services and need budget amendments.

It was moved by Lewis, seconded by Green, that the Superior Township Board receive the financial report.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

8. COMMUNICATIONS

A. EMAIL FROM ALYSSA GURKEY, SUTTON RIDGE – REDWOOD REZONING

It was moved by Caviston, seconded by Green, that the Superior Township Board receive the email from Ms. Gurkey.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

9. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

A. ORDINANCE 174-18, SUTTON RIDGE – REDWOOD ACQUISITION LLC, AREA PLAN AMENDMENT

Township Attorney, Fred Lucas, addressed the Board and the audience at length about the area plan amendment. He addressed the need to amend the Development Agreement for Phase 1 and 2 of the Bromley Condos; the Letter Agreement signed by the Bromley COA; the issues relating to form of ownership and the fact that homes and condos in the area are already being leased; the need to make a decision with a rational basis for the action taken; the need for facts to prove a deleterious effect on neighboring properties; information on the selection and purpose of the Valbridge market study; the key issue is the form of ownership; the proposed changes to the proposed area plan; and, aspects of regulatory taking. He responded to numerous questions from the board and the audience.

Some Board members expressed concerns about the amount of information contained in the Valbridge study and other documents and requested additional time for study.

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It was moved by Lewis, seconded by Green, for the Board to postpone action on Ordinance No. 174-18, Sutton Ridge-Redwood Acquisition LLC, Area Plan Amendment until the Board meeting of August 15, 2016 and to schedule discussion on the issue at the July 18, 2016 Board meeting.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

10. NEW BUSINESS

A. RFP FOR TOWNSHIP WEBSITE DESIGN AND HOSTING

Clerk Phillips explained that the Township has used Washtenaw County's Zope website and hosting for about 15 years. It was free. The County is ending this service and the Township will have to transition to a new website by the end of 2016. Clerk Phillips wanted the new clerk to be involved in the process of selection and training to load items on to the website. Due to time constraints, it is necessary to start the bid process now. Clerk Phillips drafted an RFP, which he will post on the Township website and on BidNet/MITN, which is a website that many communities around the state and country use to post their RFP's. This posting results in more exposure, more transparency and provides an opportunity for all vendors to know about the RFP and bid on the project. He encouraged the Township to improve the bidding process and to use BidNet/MITN. The RFP contains background information, technical specifications, vendor background information and insurance requirements.

It was moved by Green, seconded by McKinney, for the Board to approve Superior Township RFP 2016-001, Website Design and Hosting and to approve posting it.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

B. RESOLUTION 2016-09, RECOGNIZING RETIREMENT OF KEITH LOCKIE

Board members spoke in support of Mr. Lockie and the work he performed for the Township.

It was moved by McKinney, seconded by Green, for the Board to approve the following resolution:

AND HIS YEARS OF HONORABLE SERVICE WITH SUPERIOR TOWNSHIP'S
PARKS, UTILITY AND ACCOUNTING DEPARTMENTS**

WHEREAS, on February 17, 1998, Keith Lockie began his career with Superior Township as the Administrator for the Parks and Recreation Department; and,

WHEREAS, Under Mr. Lockie's direction and stewardship the Superior Township Parks and nature preserves significantly improved in appearance and functionality. His sense of fairness and professionalism established excellent relations with his employees, the Township Board and the Park Commission; and,

WHEREAS, as a result of this outstanding performance the Township Board appointed Mr. Lockie as the accountant for the Utility Department; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Lockie demonstrated repeated excellence by managing crucial financial functions including accounts payable, accounts receivable and the annual financial utility department audit. In 2003 he assisted the elected officials by preparing documents necessary to finance a \$3.5 million joint fire and utility bond. He assisted with the refinancing of the \$6 million YCUA/Wiard Road Sanitary Sewer Interceptor bond, and the \$3.5 million fire and utility bond. Additionally, he also assisted with submitting and administration of the State of Michigan energy efficiency and conservation block grant, which resulted in the renovation and improvements to the utility department administration building and the Township Hall; and,

WHEREAS, Mr. Lockie also assisted with specialized accounting and financial functions of numerous other Township projects including the oversight of grants for non-motorized trails and analyzing costs and benefits of the Township's health care plans; and,

WHEREAS, under his leadership the Utility Department met the standards set forth by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality to become a certified water and sanitary systems operator,

WHEREAS, because of the continuing trust and respect for Mr. Lockie by the Township board, and because he had established himself as a highly competent, skilled, professional and invaluable asset to the Township, he was appointed to the office of Financial Controller for the Township; and

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WHEREAS, as Controller he reorganized the Township's accounting and reporting practices elevating the Township's financial practices into a state of the art model of efficiency, accuracy and transparency; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Superior Township Board of Trustees recognizes, salutes and applauds the career of Keith Lockie, and the Superior Township Board of Trustee can justifiably state that his body of work will leave a lasting legacy of accomplishment and proficiency; and,

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Superior Township Board of Trustees takes great pleasure in congratulating Keith Lockie on this retirement from Superior Township and herewith expresses its sincere gratitude for the invaluable contributions Keith Lockie has made to the various Superior Township departments and the community of Superior Township.

BE IT FUTHER RESOLVED that this resolution will be recorded in the permanent minutes of the Superior Township Board of Trustees and that copies will be sent to Keith Lockie to share with his family.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

C. RESOLUTION 2016-10, BROOKSIDE STREET CRACK SEALING

Supervisor Schwartz explained that the crack sealing was needed to prolong the life of the asphalt and that this was a good price.

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WHEREAS, the Brookside subdivision is in Superior Township and located south of Geddes east of Harris and north of Stamford; and,

WHEREAS, the roads for Brookside are in fair to good condition and not yet deteriorated and can be rehabilitated with an application of crack seal; and,

WHEREAS, to crack seal the roads in Brookside will lengthen the useful life of the roads and lower costs for the township in the long run; and,

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Superior Township Board of Trustees hereby approves Hutch Paving to crack seal the public roads in the Brookside Subdivision in the total amount of \$18,176.00 payable from general fund line item 101-446-866-000, roads.

D. ORDINANCE NO 191, PROPERTY MAINTENANCE ORDINANCE, FIRST READING

It was explained that the Township needed to update its adoption by reference of the International Property Maintenance Code to the 2015 edition.

The following resolution was moved by Green, and seconded by Lewis:

ORDINANCE NUMBER 191

**ORDINANCE FOR THE ADOPTION OF THE 2015 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE
CODE
WHICH REPEALS AND REPLACES ORDINANCE NUMBER 153 ADOPTION OF
THE 2000 PROPERTY MAINTENANCE CODE**

An Ordinance of the Charter Township of Superior adopting the 2015 edition of the International Property Maintenance Code, regulating and governing the conditions and maintenance of all property, buildings and structures; by providing the standards for supplied utilities and facilities and other physical things and conditions essential to ensure that structures are safe, sanitary and

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fit for occupation and use; and the condemnation of buildings and structures unfit for human occupancy and repealing Ordinance Number 153 of the Charter Township of Superior and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict therewith.

The Board of Trustees of the Charter Township of Superior does ordain as follows:

Section 1. Adoption of International Property Maintenance Code. That a certain document, three (3) copies of which are on file in the office of the Clerk of the Charter Township of Superior, being marked and designated as the *International Property Maintenance Code, 2015* edition, as published by the International Code Council, be and is hereby adopted as the Property Maintenance Code of the Charter Township of Superior, in the State of Michigan for regulating and governing the conditions and maintenance of all property, essential to ensure that structures are safe, sanitary and fit for occupation and use; and the condemnation of buildings and structures unfit for human occupancy and use, and the demolition of such existing structures as herein provided; and each and all of the regulations, provisions, penalties, conditions and terms of said Property Maintenance Code on file in the office of the Clerk are hereby referred to, adopted, and made a part hereof, as if fully set out in this legislation, with the additions, deletions and changes, if any, prescribed in Section 2 of this ordinance.

Section 2. Code Amendments. The following sections are hereby revised:

A. Section 101.1. Insert: Charter Township of Superior, Washtenaw County, State of Michigan

B. Section 103.5. Deleted and replace with the following:

The Township Board may establish by resolution a schedule of fees for activities and services performed by the department in carrying out its responsibilities under this code. Such schedule may be amended from time to time. Fee schedules shall be published in the manner as required by law and except as otherwise provide by law, shall be effective on the day after publication.

C. Section 106. Deleted and replace with the following:

106.1 Unlawful acts. It shall be unlawful for a person, firm or corporation to be in conflict with or in violation of any of the provisions of this code.

106.2 Notice of violation. The code official shall serve a notice of violation or order in accordance with Section 107.

106.3 Prosecution of violation. Any person failing to comply with a notice of violation or order served in accordance with Section 107 shall be deemed responsible of a civil infraction, and the violation shall be deemed a strict liability offense. If the notice of violation is not complied with, the code official shall

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institute the appropriate proceeding at law or in equity to restrain, collect or abate such violation, or to require the removal or termination of the unlawful occupancy of the structure in violation of the provisions of this code or of the order or direction made pursuant thereto. Any action taken by the authority having jurisdiction on such premises shall be charged against the real estate upon which the structure is located and shall be a lien upon such real estate.

106.4 Violation penalties. Any person who shall violate a provision of this code, or fail to comply therewith, or with any of the requirements thereof, shall be prosecuted within the limits provided by state or local laws. Each day that a violation continues after due notice has been served shall be deemed a separate offense.

106.5 Abatement of violation. The imposition of the penalties herein prescribed shall not preclude the legal officer of the jurisdiction from instituting appropriate action to restrain, correct or abate a violation, or to prevent illegal occupancy of a building, structure or premises, or to stop an illegal act, conduct, business or utilization of the building, structure or premises.

D. Section 112.4. Delete and replace with the following:

Failure to Comply. Any person who shall continue any work after having been served with a stop work order, except such work as that person is directed to perform to remove a violation or unsafe condition, shall be subject to fines and prosecution per sections 106.3 and 106.4.

E. Section 302.4. Delete and replace with the following:

Weeds. *Premises and exterior property* shall be maintained free from weeds or plant growth in accordance with the Charter Township of Superior Ordinance No. 179, Turf Grass, Weeds and Brush.

F. Section 304.14. Insert for the first "DATE" "April 1". Insert for the second "DATE" "November 1"

G. Section 602.3. Insert for the first "DATE" "January 1". Insert for the second "DATE" "December 31"

H. Section 602.4. Insert for the first "DATE" "January 1". Insert for the second "DATE" "December 31"

Section 3. Repealer. That Ordinance Number 153 of the Charter Township of Superior entitled Ordinance for the Adoption of the 2000 Property Maintenance Code Ordinance Number 153 and all other ordinances or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

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Section 4. Severability. That if any section, subsection, sentence, clause or phrase of this legislation is, for any reason, held to be unconstitutional, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this ordinance. The Charter Township of Superior Board of Trustees hereby declares that it would have passed this law, and each section, subsection, clause or phrase thereof, irrespective of the fact that any one or more sections, subsections, sentences, clauses and phrases be declared unconstitutional.

Sections 5. Preservation of Actions. That nothing in this legislation or in the Property Maintenance Code hereby adopted shall be construed to affect any suit or proceeding impending in any court, or any rights acquired, or liability incurred, or any cause or causes of action acquired or existing, under any act or ordinance hereby repealed as cited in Section 3 of this law; nor shall any just of legal right or remedy of any character be lost, impaired or affected by this legislation.

Section 6. Publication. That the Charter Township of Superior Clerk is hereby ordered and directed to cause this legislation to be published in the manner as required by law and except as otherwise provide by law, shall be effective on the day after final publication.

Mr. Schwartz and Mr. Phillips,

I am writing to express my great concern over the approval of the Redwood Apartments. I've been attending every meeting on the issue including the planning commission ones, and this has been very upsetting. When I bought my unit, I NEVER expected apartments to be built in that area right in the MIDDLE of our community, not adjacent to, but smack dab in the middle. I know there are many of the homeowners who are upset over the issue as well. The study that was done on values of property next to apartments is not comparable to this scenario because none of those complexes were nested WITHIN another community, but were next to the other community with their own road in and out. Putting up a no throughput sign or private road is NOT going to stop traffic from going down our private Kenwyck Drive that we pay to maintain and resurface, etc. Who is going to enforce keeping the road private when we can't even get the 25 miles/hour speed limit enforced in our community? Tracy Pitt (the home owner association president), brought letters to the planning commission meeting which documented interest in the land from condo builders, but they wouldn't be able to start on the project for a year or so. There is no guarantee that these apartments would never be converted to section 8 which would completely destroy our community. I agree that there will be extra traffic in our neighborhoods even if condos are built there, but if that were the case, there would be one entrance/exit going into the house section and one entrance/exit going through the condos, eliminating the traffic onto N Kenwyck Dr and distributing the traffic throughout both communities. The people living in apartments are short-term residents 1-3 yrs on average, so they have no vested interest in the community. While some condos are rented out, there is still a vested interest because they are owned by and need to be maintained in order to continue renting or to eventually sell. I believe the condo board by remaining "neutral" or not giving the owners the opportunity to vote on the issues, have given the township board the impression that we don't care if they are built. That is NOT the case. There are many of us that are not happy as you see by the signed petition from both the condo and homeowners that was presented at the Planning Commission meeting. Where would Redwood put their sign showing their location? If it's posted in front of the condo entrance, this could lead to many people believing all the units there are

apartments. Even though the mobile home park is right next door to us, there is no problem because that is its own community. It is not nested in the middle of our community, and it has a separate entrance/exit. Who's going to ensure the upkeep and maintenance of the apartments if they are built. Sure they say they will keep the property looking nice and would never sell it, so it couldn't become section 8, but we all know nothing is guaranteed. Look at our original builder who left us broke and in debt, and this situation that now leaves us in a place we never planned on being the possibility of apartments built instead of condos as proposed. I ask that you support the community and maintain this location as the original plans of this area being developed for condos.

Dear Board Member,

I am writing to address an issue that will be on the future agenda of the Township Board of Trustees concerning the proposed rezoning of Parcel #J-10-35-100-006 for apartment construction.

I would hope that the board would be able to put themselves in the shoes of the 300 or so households in the Bromley Park community when looking at the issue of rezoning the vacant land there. According to the original township approved plan, that land was meant to contain the second phase of owner occupied condominiums. Every homeowner in Bromley Park, whether original or more recent owners, such as myself, bought their home with the expectation that at some point that land would contain more owner occupied housing. It has not happened yet, but with home values rising in our area, people are feeling good again about the investment they made in purchasing in Bromley Park. As values increase it will become more appealing to a potential builder to come in and complete the second phase of the condominiums.

There is no rush to stray from the original plan. To allow a rental project in its place that is totally landlocked within the existing community is not compatible with the original plan or the close knit, owner invested neighborhood that has been established there since 2004. I strongly feel, as do my fellow Bromley Park homeowners, that the Valbridge study that was conducted is invalid. The Valbridge study addresses apartment communities 'adjacent to' or 'neighboring' owner occupied home communities. The proposed rezoning will be right in the middle of an established owner occupied community. The study compares apples to oranges. Home values would surely decrease.

The existing Bromley Park community, in which all the residents are governed by the rules and regulations of a Homeowners Association Agreement, can use these rules as a standard to which all homeowners must comply. By shoehorning this project in the middle of this community where the tenants will be using the roads and sidewalks throughout the neighborhood, but are not subject to any of the regulations like the homeowners that are their immediate neighbors, is a recipe for disharmony. Neither the Bromley Park community nor the Township will have any control over this project once it is approved and put in place.

Redwood has made well-meaning promises but the fact is there will be no means to hold them to any of these so-called guarantees in the future. At any time after this is approved they can change their target renter, renting criteria, or even sell the whole project to a completely different company who would then have no connection or obligation to uphold any of these promises.

While no one can know for sure the future impact of sticking a rental complex in the middle of a friendly, active neighborhood made up of invested homeowners like Bromley Park, this community does not want to leave it to chance that everything will just work out. I am sure there are other areas in Superior Township that are not within an existing subdivision for these apartments to be built. The investments we have in our homes and community both financial and the everyday interactions with our neighbors are too valuable to us to gamble on a project that just does not fit here.

Please vote no on the proposed rezoning.

I am a resident of Bromley Park subdivision and wanted to write to you to echo many of my neighbors' concerns over the proposed Redwood Apartment development that would go up behind our community.

I reviewed the study that indicated that an apartment complex does not adversely impact home values. Most, if not all, of the comparison developments had their own entrances. In my opinion, the shared entrance is the most concerning aspect of this particular proposal. While the intent appears to be that all apartment traffic would go through the condominium entrance, Bromley Park is connected and I expect some apartment traffic would find it's way through Bromley Park. There is a lot of pedestrian traffic to and from the pool and playground area, which would now have much more vehicle traffic to contend with.

I would like to see some comparisons of home values where an entrance was shared with an apartment complex as it would be more of an "apples to apples" comparison. If the development could have it's own entrance, I think many of the concerns of my neighbors would be eased. I urge you to stop this development until a better comparison can be made or a separate entrance can be designed.

We are writing to you today to urge you to vote against changing the zoning of Bromley Park to allow Redwood to build their apartments. One or both of us have attended just about every Superior Twp. hearing on this issue. We understand how difficult this decision is for you. We know that the decision to deny ultimately comes down to whether you can come to a rational basis for your actions, and as Fred said, it cannot be arbitrary or capricious, but it has to do with the form of ownership and what makes this situation different than others.

We were both grateful that the board sanctioned the study conducted to investigate the potential deleterious effects of apartments in a private home owner neighborhood. The investigation was thorough and well researched. We know that the task was not easy, but the problem is the investigation could not discover any comparable examples in Michigan to the unique situation in Bromley Park. The fact that Redwood is going to be completely contained within our neighborhood, but is not going to be part of the neighborhood community is problematic. The condos and homeowners associations have a collaborative partnership on a wide range of collective community issues and the apartments are not going to partner in these endeavors with us. While the investigation was only tasked with looking at the financial impact on the nearby neighborhoods, there will likely be other impacts that the study did not investigate. Furthermore, given the uniqueness of the situation in Bromley, we are concerned that we still do not have an accurate enough understanding of the financial impacts of having a company owned housing unit completely encapsulated by privately owned homes. These incompatibility issues between the company and the neighborhood are critical.

Furthermore, condos can be built on this site. A letter was presented to the planning commission by Tracy Pitt in which a builder expressed interest in buying the property to construct condos. This should invalidate the principle of regulatory taking. Finally, the argument has been made that few builders are constructing condos right now, so having housing construction, even if that housing is an apartment complex, is a net positive. We do not consider this a valid argument. First, there are several condo complexes being constructed in the greater area – Ypsilanti Twp, Ypsilanti, Scio Twp, and Ann Arbor all have condo construction. Second, by that logic, rather than rezoning for apartments, the Bromley space should be rezoned for single-family housing. We grant that this is a bit of a straw man as no one has currently requested a zoning change to single-family housing. However, the point of bringing this up is that the argument for apartment building in lieu of less popular condominiums is not strong either.

Thank you for taking the time to hear the community on this issue, and for making sure you as a board have done your due diligence. We appreciate all the time and effort you have spent researching, discussing, and meeting about this issue.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Superior Township Board exercises its first right of refusal as to parcel number J-10-35-372-008 and authorizes a payment to the Washtenaw County Treasurer in the amount of thirty thousand three hundred and thirty four dollars, (\$30,334.00) with said funds to be used from the General Fund, GL 101-890-985.000 Miscellaneous Expenses, which will require a budget amendment.

RE: Township Website Design and Hosting

Washtenaw County will end website hosting and service for all communities this year. They would like us to transition to new website hosting by January 2017. On June 20, 2016 the Board approved a posting of a RFP for the Township website design and hosting. I posted the RFP on the Township website and on the Michigan Inter-Governmental Trade Network (MITN), www.mitn.info/. It received plenty of exposure, was available to all interested parties and I received a good response. I received RFP's from 20 different vendors.

I was not provided with a budget for the RFP but I indicated in the RFP that other communities in Washtenaw County had completed similar transitions for under \$10,000 but we may be able to spend more in order to have the features we want. I assume the cost will be assigned to G.L 100-266.962.000, Special Projects and will require a budget amendment. The RFP's vary in price from \$2,389 to \$44,000 for the website design and construction. There will be other charges related maintenance, service, loading content on the website and hosting. There are numerous differences among the various RFP's related to the template, design, features, time to complete the project, security and hosting. It will take some time to sort through them in order to make reasonable comparisons.

As the website is an important part of our Township's image, I want to be sure that all Board members are comfortable with the design, format, hosting and vendor for the website. I am seeking direction on how the Board wants to me to proceed. I have provided you with copies of all of the RFP's. Do you want to interview some of the vendors? Do you want the administrative staff (Supervisor, Clerk, Treasurer) to make a recommendation to the Board? Do you want me to continue to handle everything and bring a recommendation to the Board?

I think it is important that the Board make a decision and approve a vendor by the August 15 Board meeting.

There are also other issues that need to be sorted out. Who will be trained to load items? Who will have the primary responsibility for maintaining the website? I also think we should have a Board policy on website content and management.

You indicated your vehicle is equipped with a freezer and a refrigerator. This writer found your application to be filled out completely and truthfully. You included all required materials. I verified that the liability insurance through Great American Alliance Insurance Co. is in effect until August 10, 2016. The Certificate of No-Fault insurance you provided indicates an expiration date of 11/16/2016. The Michigan Department of State Bureau of Branch Office Services Request Report you provided is dated 05/12/2016 and indicates "NO REPORTABLE DRIVING HISTORY ENTRIES" and "LICENSE VALID". I verified your employment at Burger King. I contacted the two references you provided. Ms. Gulley gave you a good reference. Mr. Martin said you have lived across the street from him for a number of years but he did not know you well enough to give you a reference.

On June 1, 2016, a deputy from the Washtenaw County Sheriff's Department completed an inspection of your 1995 Mercury Villager vehicle and found several safety equipment violations. On June 6, 2016 the deputy re-inspected the vehicle, found all violations were corrected and the vehicle passed the vehicle number and equipment inspection.

The Food Peddler's Application for Year 2016, issued by the Washtenaw County Department of Planning & Environment indicates you are approved to sell "prepackaged ice cream, chips, candy, pop, juice, etc." This writer contacted Mr. Underwood of the Washtenaw County Health Department and he indicated that you are NOT approved to sell "bread, eggs, milk and cheese". You are only approved to sell prepackaged items such as ice cream, candy, pop and chips. When I discussed this with you on June 6, 2016, you indicated you would comply with Mr. Underwood's instructions and only sell the approved prepackaged goods.

In your application you included a "List of Convictions", which indicates you were convicted of two or more misdemeanors and six felonies, with the last conviction occurring in 2005. On May 31, 2016, this writer submitted an inquiry to the Michigan


State Police Internet Criminal History Access Tool (ICHAT) and it indicated "Page contains no data". This writer emailed ICHAT and asked why the inquiry resulted in the "Page contains no data" response but as of this date, I have not received a response from ICHAT. **SECTION 14.1 OF ORDINANCE NO. 189
OF CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SUPERIOR MICHIGAN**

I Jimmie Lee Mack Jr applied for a solicitor's license on May 26, 2016 for non-commercial, religious purposes to Charter Township of Superior Michigan and was denied the license, as similar to 2015,2014 in prior years. When applying for the the license (eventhough exempt) there is nothing on the application that indicates whether the applicant is applying for commercial purposes as defined in section 1.4 of Ordinance No.189 Commercial purposes means any business or activity carried on for profit. or non-commercial purposes as defined section 1.7 of Charter Township of Superior Ordinance No.189 Non-commercial purposes means any purpose other than that involving a business or activity carried on for profit, including, but not limited to, a political, religious or charitable purpose, or an activity sponsored by a political, religious, not-for-profit charitable, benevolent, educational, philanthropic, humane, patriotic or civic organization of persons, registered and in good standing under Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code. This also means

candidates or persons going door-to-door on behalf of a political candidate(s) or other political purposes or voter registration. To add, there is nothing on the application that indicates if the applicant is applying for religious purposes as defined section 1.2 of ordinance No. 189

Charitable, religious or political organization means a not-for-profit charitable, religious, political, benevolent, educational, philanthropic, humane, patriotic, or civic organization of persons, registered and in good standing under Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code, that solicits or obtains contributions solicited from the public for charitable, religious or political purposes. Moreover, there is nothing on the application to tell the applicant if for religious purposes that the applicant does not need to apply for a Solicitor's license, does not need to register and is exempt as defined as 14.1 of Ordinance No.189

Persons involved in soliciting, canvassing or peddling for any noncommercial purpose, and/or delivery of handbills. This includes those working on behalf of a charitable, religious or political organization, political candidate(s) or voter registration. Persons when engaged in soliciting in the neighborhood of their residence, which solicitation is sponsored by any public, parochial or private elementary, middle, junior or high school or by a recognized charitable, religious, political or subdivision organization are hereby exempt from the licensing, registration and fee requirements of this Ordinance, but shall be subject to the other sections of this Ordinance. on June 10, I recieved a letter from David Phillips, (Clerk of Charter Township of Superior) dated May 07, 2016 refusing to issue a Solicitor's license from an application dated May 26, 2016. on June 13, 2016(I called David Plillips about the date of the letter because of Due process reasons and he corrected the date of the letter to June 07, 2016) in the letter David Phillips quoted (" **this writer found your application to be filled out completely and truthfully. You included all required materials**") yet refuse to issue a license based upon section 13.1(4) The clerk may refuse to issue a license to an applicant: Who has been convicted of a felony or any crime related to or involving larceny, assault, fraud, receiving

and concealing stolen property, embezzlement, robbery, home invasion, breaking and entering, theft, dishonesty, false statement or fraudulent scheme, trick or device, criminal sexual misconduct or any crime that is an unreasonable threat to persons or property within the Township. Who is arrested for a violation of federal, state or local laws, ordinances, or regulations reflecting adversely on the licensee's ability to conduct the business for which the license has applied for. However, I was convicted of numerous crimes over 11 years ago none of the enumerated crimes listed in 13.1 above. First of all, I had the ability to start an business called W2 DIGITAL MEDIA SOLUTIONS in 2010. Next, I had the ability to start another Business call Tax Concepts in 2012. Third, I've been involved in Church Organizations since My release from prison in 2007, and became a Licensed Evangelist in 2013. Last, I have the ability to conduct business in Superior Township of Michigan. But being exempt, I asked David Philips during our conversation on June 13, 2016 is there an application or form to fill out for soliciting for non-commercial & religious purposes like other nearby Townships have, David Phillips said "no". "We are not as advanced as other Townships". I said what is the requirements of soliciting for religious purposes, and that I read ordinance No. 189 section 14.1, and that if im doing my soliciting for non-commercial and religious purposes (what i've been tring to do ever year I've applied) did not have to apply for a license or even had to register. David Philips then asked me if I was a Licensed Preacher, I said yes Sir, I am a preacher under a Pastor. David Plillips said generally people let us know what they are going to do in the community for religious purposes, how they plan to solicit. Then David Phillips asked me to provide a letter stating how I plan to solicit, copy of my Evangelist license, and the churches 501(c)(3) number. I provided the letter with all the information on June 16, 2016 to David Phillips he said he would check into it and get back with me (eventhough exempt in accordance to section 14.1 of Ordinance No.189) On June 17, 2016 David Phillips called me and said I called your pastor he has not got back with me, we are going to deny approval of your soliciting for religious purposes because the Organization

is desolved according to Superior Township Supervisor Kenneth Schwartz I said to David Phillips call my Pastor and tell him that. I called David Phillips back to make sure he got the misunderstanding straight in regards to the churches 501(c)(3) later on that day he stated"you need to set up a meeting with other board members because we are not convinced you are a licensed preacher and that you are soliciting for religious purposes. I said to David Phillips how can I prove to the other board members that im a licensed preacher and that im soliciting for non-commercial, religious purposes. David Phillips said I don't know I told your Pastor to put something on a church letterhead but I have other things to do. I said to David Phillips, if section **14.1 of Ordinance No. 189** Persons involved in soliciting, canvassing or peddling for any noncommercial purpose, and/or delivery of handbills. This includes those working on behalf of a charitable, religious or political organization, political candidate(s) or voter registration. Persons when engaged in soliciting in the neighborhood of their residence, which solicitation is sponsored by any public, parochial or private elementary, middle, junior or high school or by a recognized charitable, religious, political or subdivision organization are hereby exempt from the licensing, registration and fee requirements of this Ordinance, but shall be subject to the other sections of this Ordinance. Why are you still having me register, I am exempt and this is a Federal issue because you are violating my first Amendment rights, & impeding me from the free excercise of religion, David Phillips agreed . I said to David Phillips I should be able to go out in the community and fundraise without no problems from the Police right? all I got to do is show them my Evangelist License and tell them im exempt right? Mr Phillips said you can do what you want to do, but if the police stop you, they probably going to ask you a lot of questions, they can give you a ticket and it's best to get our approval. Another letter was provided to David Phillips and the board on June 21, 2016 on the Church letterhead from my Pastor Clarence Lewis dated June 20, 2016 attached with this Appeal and Complaint, & copy of Evangelist License. Furthermore, Ordinance No.189, "an ordinance to regulate

peddlers and solicitors in the Township and to repeal Ordinance No.173 (which was created in 2015 with more requirements making it harder for non-commercial religious solicitors to qualify) was designed to prevent, deprive, confuse, and stop religious organizations, etc from soliciting for non-commercial, religious purposes & excersing there 1st Amendment rights. The application process does not give you an indication what to do if applying for non-commercial, religious purposes or tell the applicant no need to apply because they are exempt and to refer to section 14.1 of Ordinance No.189. Ordinance No. 189 does not state or define how the Township determines those who are exempt, nor does Ordinance No. 189 state or define any required approval needed from the clerk (as stated by David Phillips) or board for soliciting for non-commercial religious purposes. To conclude, I've been tring to fundraise in my community of residence for the last 3 years as exempt but because Superior Township Ordinance No. 189 an Ordinance to regulate Ordinance No. 173(repealed in 2015) and the application process is designed to prevent, deprive, confuse, stop religious organizations from access to solicit for non-commercial purposes. To add, Ordinance No. 189 section 14.1 is not designed for those working on behalf of a charitable, religious or political organization, political candidate(s) or voter registration. Ordinance No. 189 section 14.1 is designed for the Farmers, Farmers with land and there decendants not a minority Organization. Ordinance No. 189 section 14.1 is not designed for a minority of a Religious Organization. Check the history of licensed solicitors in Superior Township of Michigan as of June 21, 2016 & see how many if any are minority or how many Solicitor's Licenses has ever been approved. (very few if any.) David Phillips and the Township Board has and still is violating my first amendment right because they refuse to accept that im a licensed Evangelist tring to solicit on behalf of my church for non-commercial religious purposes. David Phillips is violating my First Amendment rights & section 14.1 of Ordinance No.189 because he is requiring me to submit proposals of soliciting for non-commercial religious purposes , get approval and submit a letter on church letterhead. section

14.1 of Ordinance No. 189 does not require such approval but states" Persons when engaged in soliciting in the neighborhood of their residence, which solicitation is sponsored by any public, parochial or private elementary, middle, junior or high school or by a recognized charitable, religious political or subdivision organization are hereby exempt from the licensing, registration and fee requirements of this Ordinance. For the reasons listed in this appeal and complaint I ask the Board to grant me Jimmie Lee Mack Jr (licensed Evangelist) A Solicitors license for non-commercial religious purposes so that law enforcement does'nt harass me or bother me and give me anymore tickets for soliciting without a license. To the Honorable Court I ask that New Millennium Baptist Church be compensated \$50,400.00=(@\$100.00(x)6days)(x)4weeks)(x)(7months) (x)3years from Charter Township of Superior Michigan because of the delay of our Fundraiser for the past three years due to the violation of the churches 1st Amendment rights and violation of the Townships Ordinance No. 189 section 14.1, The process for non-commercial purposes and it's exempt provisions are unclear, hindering us and requiring an approval, the harassment I Jimmie Lee Mack jr recieved from Law Enforcement & Tresspass notice(s), tickets for soliciting without a permit (when exempt) (that later a Judge dismissed in prior years). The Financial burden of the church for the past 3 years, and when provided documention (when we were not required) still disqualified us by calling us desolved and not convinced that I Jimmie Mack jr is a Licensed Evangelist.

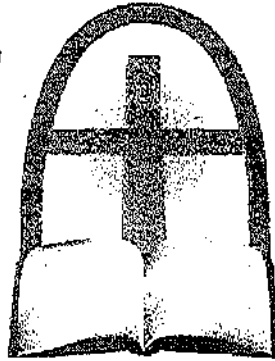

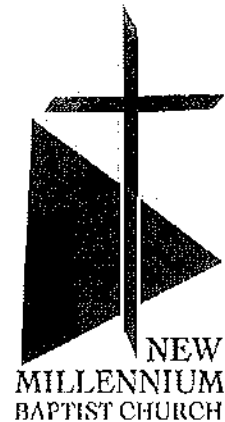

ORDINANCE NO. 189

An ordinance to regulate peddlers and solicitors in the Township and to repeal Ordinance 173.

The Charter Township of Superior hereby ordains:

Section 1. Definitions.

The following words, terms and phrases, when used in this chapter, shall have the meanings ascribed to them in this section, except where the context clearly indicates a different meaning:

- 1.1 *Canvassing and soliciting* meaning the going from door to door, house to house, place to place, street to street or remaining in one place within the Township for the purpose of soliciting orders for or canvassing occupants or residents for the sale of food products, books, magazines, goods, wares or merchandise of any nature whatsoever for future delivery, or for the purpose of soliciting orders for or canvassing occupants or residents for the installation or servicing of any household equipment or appliances, including but not limited to, furnace or boiler repair and maintenance, repair and servicing of washing windows and screens, awnings, roofing and siding of buildings or for any other services to be furnished. It shall also include persons soliciting for funds or donations of any kind. It shall also include the assisting of others in canvassing and/or soliciting. Newsboys and persons traveling on a regularly established route at the request, expressed or implied, of their customers, are not to be considered within the definitions of "peddler" or "canvasser" under the terms of this chapter.
- 1.2 *Charitable, religious or political organization* means a not-for-profit charitable, religious, political, benevolent, educational, philanthropic, humane, patriotic, or civic organization of persons, registered and in good standing under Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code, that solicits or obtains contributions solicited from the public for charitable, religious or political purposes.
- 1.3 *Clerk* means the clerk for the Township, or the Clerk's designated representative.
- 1.4 *Commercial purposes* means any business or activity carried on for profit.
- 1.5 *Handbill* means any written or printed notice distributed by hand for the purpose of communication, including but not limited to any pamphlet, booklet or leaflet.

- 1.6 *Minor* means a person under 18 years of age.
- 1.7 *Non-commercial purposes* means any purpose other than that involving a business or activity carried on for profit, including, but not limited to, a political, religious or charitable purpose, or an activity sponsored by a political, religious, not-for-profit charitable, benevolent, educational, philanthropic, humane, patriotic or civic organization of persons, registered and in good standing under Section 501(c)(3) of the Federal Internal Revenue Code. This also means candidates or persons going door-to-door on behalf of a political candidate(s) or other political purposes or voter registration.
- 1.8 *Peddling* means the going from door to door, house to house, place to place, street to street, or remaining in one place, in the Township carrying or conveying or transporting by person, wagon, motor vehicles or other type of conveyance for the purpose of offering for immediate sale, food products, including but not limited to, meat, fish, vegetables, farm produce or provisions, candy, goods, wares or merchandise of any nature and landscaping materials of all types. It shall also include the assisting of others in "peddling".
- 1.9 *Person* means and includes any person, agent, firm, partnership, association, corporation, company or organization of any kind.

Section 2. Soliciting, peddling or canvassing on posted private property or when requested not to do so.

It shall be unlawful for any person to solicit, peddle or canvass upon any private property in the Township, if requested by anyone in control upon the premises not to do so, or if there is placed on such premises in a conspicuous position near the entrance thereof a sign or similar notice indicating in any manner that the occupants of such premises do not desire to have solicitors, canvassers or peddlers call upon them. For purposes of this section, soliciting and peddling includes religious proselytizing, political speech (anonymous or otherwise) and passing out handbills.

Section 3. Hours of operation.

It shall be unlawful for any person to conduct, or attempt to conduct, any canvassing, soliciting or peddling before the hours of 9:00 a.m. and after dusk, at any location within the Township.

Section 4. Use and restriction of stops, scales, bells, horns, etc.

- 4.1 No person shall stop in any one place longer than is necessary to make a sale or stop on private property without the consent of the owner. No person shall stop for the purposes of selling or offering to sell any food products within a distance of 300 feet from any public, private, charter or parochial school building, or the lands on which such buildings are located in the Township on any day during which school is in session. No person operating as a solicitor, canvasser or peddler shall interfere with traffic or cause or permit large numbers of

persons, especially children, to congregate upon the public streets.

- 4.2 It shall be unlawful for any person to call out or make any noise of any kind whatsoever, or to use a bell, horn or other noise making device so as to unreasonably disturb persons in the immediate vicinity for an extended period of time with the purpose of attracting persons to buy goods such as licensee has for sale.

Section 5. Vehicles, sanitation; health standards.

- 5.1 All vehicles used in the sale of food products must be kept clean and sanitary conditions at all times, and when containing loads or parts of loads of food products they must be kept only in places and operated in a manner which, in the opinion of the health officer for the county department of health and the state department of agriculture, are sanitary and wholesome.
- 5.2 All vehicles used for the purpose of selling or transportation of meat, milk, pastry, ice cream and all other food products for human consumption in the Township shall be inspected and have in possession a current valid approval by the county board of health, or the state department of agriculture before a license is granted. The holder of a license under which a food vending vehicle is operated shall be the person responsible for all the conditions and requirements of this chapter.
- 5.3 Failure to maintain the standards and requirements of the county board of health or the state department of agriculture for the sale or transportation of food will constitute cause for revocation of the license under which such vehicles are operated.
- 5.4 All vehicles used in the sale of any products shall be maintained in good working condition. Applicant shall maintain evidence of proper public liability and personal injury insurance in the amount of not less than the minimum amounts required by the State Motor Vehicle Code. Upon request they shall provide proof of inspection by the Township's designated agent to ensure the motor vehicle used for soliciting or peddling meets all the requirements of the Michigan Vehicle Code.

Section 6. Minors; soliciting, canvassing or peddling, requirements.

If an applicant is a minor, the following provisions shall apply:

- 6.1 An approved copy of the work permit issued by the State of Michigan, showing the approved hours of work and the job duties of each minor shall be attached to the application, and
- 6.2 Minor(s) shall at all times be under the direct supervision of an adult

Section 7. Misrepresentation.

- 7.1 No fraudulent or misleading representations to any person shall be made in connection with any peddling or soliciting activities, including, but not limited to, any misleading representation concerning the product or service involved, the purposes for which contributions solicited will be used, the name of the peddler or solicitor, the trade name and nature of the parent organization, or the purposes for which the parent organization was organized.
- 7.2 No person shall represent that the issuance of a solicitor registration certificate under this chapter is an endorsement by the Township of the solicitor, its products or the organization the solicitor represents.

Section 8. Solicitation of persons inside motor vehicles prohibited.

No peddler or solicitor shall solicit the immediate payment of money from a person who is inside a motor vehicle.

Section 9. Fixed stands prohibited.

No peddler or solicitor shall establish a fixed stand and/or store for soliciting upon any street, road, highway, lane, sidewalk, driveway, alley or publicly-owned property, unless said stand and/or store shall be in compliance with all applicable provisions of the Township Zoning Ordinance.

Section 10. License required.

Unless exempt, it shall be unlawful for any person to engage in or carry on the business of soliciting, canvassing or peddling for commercial purposes in the Township as defined Section 1, without first obtaining a license from the Township in compliance with the provisions of this Ordinance. and each vehicle, piece of equipment or container used in connection therewith.

Section 11. Application.

- 11.1 An application for the license required by this Ordinance shall be made upon a form provided by the Clerk, which shall be signed by the applicant and shall, as a minimum, contain the following:
- (1) If an individual, the name, address and telephone number of the individual.
 - (2) If a partnership, the name, residence and business address and telephone number of each partner.
 - (3) If a corporation, the name, business address and telephone number of the corporation and the name of the registered agent for the corporation.
 - (4) Two current photographs of the applicant who is to do the actual canvassing, soliciting or peddling. Each photograph shall be two inches

by two inches showing the head and shoulders of the applicant or agent(s).

- (5) A statement as to whether the applicant has been convicted of any crime, including any misdemeanor or violation of any municipal ordinance, the date and location of the conviction and the sentence imposed and if the applicant is currently under any court or parole board ordered supervision. A statement indicating if the applicant has been arrested and is awaiting disposition for any violation of federal, state or local laws or ordinances.
 - (6) The length of time for which the right to do business is sought.
 - (7) A brief description of the product or services involved.
 - (8) A description of each vehicle, along with a license plate number of each such vehicle, piece of equipment or container used in connection with the operation of the canvasser, solicitor and/or peddler.
 - (9) A current photo identification issued by a federal or state government agency.
 - (10) Provide two character references, preferably from residents of Superior Township.
- 11.2 If the applicant will be selling any products from a motor vehicle, they shall attach to the application the following:
- (1) Evidence of proper public liability and personal injury insurance in the amount of not less than the minimum amounts required by the State Motor Vehicle Code. Proof of inspection by the Township's designated agent to ensure the motor vehicle used for soliciting or peddling meets all the requirements of the Michigan Vehicle Code.
 - (2) A copy of a valid Michigan driver's license, if the applicant is selling any products from a motor vehicle;
 - (3) A copy of the applicant's master driving record obtained from the Secretary of State.
- 11.3 Application for a license under this ordinance shall be deemed as agreement by the applicant to observe all pertinent laws and regulations of the Township and defend, indemnify, and save harmless the Township from all damages or actions at law that may arise or may be brought on account of injury to persons or property resulting from the licensee's activities under this ordinance.
- 11.4 The application shall be accompanied by a nonrefundable application fee to be established by resolution of the Township Board. The Township Board may, from

time to time, modify the established fee schedule. The application fee is separate from the license fee described in Section 13.

Section 12. Investigation.

- 12.1 Upon receipt of the application for a license, the Clerk shall review the same for completeness and if the application is complete, shall cause an investigation to ensure that the applicant meets all requirements set forth in this ordinance and to insure that the representations in the application are truthful.
- 12.2 The investigation shall be completed within twenty-eight (28) calendar days of receipt of the application and after such investigation is concluded, the Clerk may:
- (1) Issue the license, upon payment of the appropriate license fee;
 - (2) Deny the license for any of the reasons set forth in Section 13.1;
 - (3) Request additional information from the applicant, if the Clerk determines that such information is needed to process the application. Once the additional information is received from the applicant, the Clerk shall have fourteen (14) calendar days to either issue or deny the license request.

Section 13. Issuance or denial; appeal of denial.

- 13.1 The clerk may refuse to issue a license to an applicant:
- (1) Whose Solicitor's license under this ordinance has been revoked within the last year.
 - (2) Who fails to completely and truthfully complete the application or who fails to fully disclose all arrests and convictions other than those that are traffic related.
 - (3) Who materially misrepresents any facts or statements on his license application.
 - (4) Who has been convicted of a felony or any crime related to or involving larceny, assault, fraud, receiving and concealing stolen property, embezzlement, robbery, home invasion, breaking and entering, theft, dishonesty, false statement or fraudulent scheme, trick or device, criminal sexual misconduct or any crime that is an unreasonable threat to persons or property within the Township. Who is arrested for a violation of federal, state or local laws, ordinances, or regulations reflecting adversely on the licensee's ability to conduct the business for which the license has applied for.

- (5) Whose master driving record indicates that his use of a motor vehicle in association with a requested license may present an unreasonable risk to persons or property within the township by such use of a motor vehicle. Who is selling any products from a motor vehicle, and
 - (a) The applicant does not have a valid Michigan driver's license, or
 - (b) The applicant has been convicted of operating a motor vehicle under the influence of liquor or operating a motor vehicle with an unlawful blood alcohol content or operating a motor vehicle under the influence of narcotics and/or other controlled substances or operating a motor vehicle while visibly impaired or any other drinking and drive offenses or any other offenses pertaining to driving and narcotics and/or controlled substances, or
 - (c) The vehicle does not meet the standards set forth in Sections 5 and 11.2 of this ordinance.
 - (6) If the applicant or activity licensed constitutes an apparent danger to the health, safety and welfare to the people of the Township.
- 13.2 Any person whose license application has been denied shall have the right to petition the Board of Trustees of the Township for an appeal. A written request for an appeal must be filed with the Clerk's office within 14 calendar days after notice of the denial has been mailed to the applicant's last known address. A written statement setting forth the grounds for the appeal must be included with the written request for an appeal. The Township Board shall grant a hearing on this appeal, and the applicant shall have the right to appear and present evidence on their behalf. Following such hearing, the Board shall make its decision by a majority vote of those Board members present at the meeting. The Township clerk shall forward notice of the decision to the licensee.
- 13.3 The Board's determination shall be based upon whether the Clerk's refusal to issue a license pursuant to Section 13.1 was supported by competent, material and substantial evidence.
- 13.4 Any person whose license application and/or appeal has been denied may not reapply for a solicitor's license until one-year after the date of application of the denied license.

Section 14. Exemptions; registration of charitable and nonprofit organizations.

- 14.1 Persons involved in soliciting, canvassing or peddling for any noncommercial purpose, and/or delivery of handbills. This includes those working on behalf of a charitable, religious or political organization, political candidate(s) or voter registration. Persons when engaged in soliciting in the neighborhood of their residence, which solicitation is sponsored by any public, parochial or private elementary, middle, junior or high school or by a recognized charitable, religious,

political or subdivision organization are hereby exempt from the licensing, registration and fee requirements of this Ordinance, but shall be subject to the other sections of this Ordinance.

- 14.2 Any person who has obtained a peddler's license from the state pursuant to Public Act No. 359 of 1921 (MCL 35.441 et seq.), on account of such person being honorably discharged from the armed forces of the United States of America shall be exempt from the licensing provisions of this article.
- 14.3 Persons engaged in uses or activities, which have been reviewed and approved by the Township as provided for in the Zoning Ordinance or a General Ordinance, including but not limited to the following: Section 5.102 Farm-Based Tourism / Entertainment Activities; Section 5.103, Farm Products Direct Marketing Business; Section 5.109 Roadside Stands; Section 5.204 Home Occupation; Section 6.05 Transient and Amusement Enterprises (this includes all vendors approved by the approved applicant); and uses and activities covered by the Michigan Right to Farm Act; State of Michigan Compiled Law or Federal Law are exempt from regulation by this ordinance.

Section 15. Fees.

- 15.1 A license fee for soliciting, canvassing and peddling for commercial purposes shall be established by resolution of the Township Board. The Township Board may, from time to time, modify the established fee schedule. This fee is separate from the application fee described in Section 12.
- 15.2 No license fee shall be charged to any person selling produce which he has raised himself, who has attained the age of 65 years, or who shows evidence of being an honorably discharged military veteran.

Section 16. Term and limitation.

Each license and registration issued pursuant to this article shall expire one year from the date of approval, unless previously terminated pursuant to this article.

Section 17. Transfer or misuse of license, badge or identification.

No license, badge or identification issued under the provisions of this Ordinance shall be used or worn at any time by any person other than the one to whom it was issued and only when engaged in the activities for which the license or I.D. card was issued.

Section 18. Display.

- 18.1 Peddlers, solicitors and canvassers are required to exhibit their license at the request of any citizen or public official.
- 18.2 If selling from a motor vehicle, the license must be displayed in a place on the motor vehicle so that it is visible from outside of the motor vehicle.

Section 19. Refuse.

The licensee shall provide refuse receptacles, which shall be used for all refuse generated by the licensee's activities conducted under this ordinance. Such refuse shall not be deposited in Township's refuse containers. The licensee shall remove the refuse receptacles at the end of the licensee's business day and leave the public right-of-way clean and free of all refuse.

Section 20. License suspension or revocation.

20.1 The Clerk may suspend a license for a period not to exceed ninety (90) calendar days upon determining, based on his or her own investigation or upon certification by a law enforcement agency that any of the following circumstances exists:

- (1) The licensee failed to truthfully provide the information required in this Ordinance in the license application, or that the licensee has engaged in a fraudulent transaction or enterprise.
- (2) The licensee has been convicted of or arrested for a violation of federal, state or local laws, ordinances, or regulations reflecting adversely on the licensee's ability to conduct the business for which the license has been issued in an honest and legal manner, including, but not limited to, burglary, theft, larceny, swindling, fraud, unlawful business practices, any form of actual or threatened physical harm against another person, or any type of criminal sexual conduct; the licensee is listed on any criminal sex offender registry or has any outstanding warrants for any misdemeanor or felony and such information was not disclosed on the application.
- (3) If the licensee will be engaging in peddling from or out of a motor vehicle in the streets and roads of the Township, the licensee's driver's license has been suspended or revoked or the licensee has been convicted of a felony moving violation.
- (4) The licensee has, in the course of peddling in the Township, engaged in conduct that is contrary to the peace, privacy, safety, health and welfare of the residents, businesses and persons in the Township.
- (5) The licensee refuses to allow any law enforcement official or Township official to enter into vehicle from which the licensee is doing business for purposes of enforcing this ordinance.
- (6) If the licensee will be engaging in peddling from or out of a motor vehicle in the streets and roads of the Township and the licensee fails to maintain any vehicle to the standards set forth in Section 5 of this ordinance.

20.2 A licensee shall be given written notice of the cause and term of the suspension

and of the right to have such suspension reversed, modified or affirmed following a hearing to be conducted by the Township Board at the next available Board meeting, following receipt of a written request by the licensee. At the hearing, the licensee shall have the right to hear the evidence relied upon by the clerk and the right to present evidence and witnesses on his or her behalf. At the hearing, or at an adjourned date, the Township Board shall determine whether to reverse, modify or affirm the suspension and shall make its decision by a majority vote of those Board members present at the meeting. The Township clerk shall forward notice of the decision to the licensee.

20.3 Before a license or registration can be revoked, the Township Board shall serve the license holder or registered applicant, by first class mail, mailed not less than four calendar days prior to the hearing with a notice of hearing, which notice shall contain the following:

- (1) Notice of proposed action.
- (2) Reason for the proposed action.
- (3) Date, time and place of hearing.
- (4) A statement that licensee may present evidence and testimony and confront adverse witnesses.

Following the hearing, the Township Board shall make its decision by a majority vote of those present at the meeting. The Clerk shall forward notice of the decision to the licensee.

20.4 The Township Board shall revoke a license issued under this Ordinance upon determination by it that based upon competent, material and substantial evidence presented at the hearing, either of the following exists:

- (1) A violation of any of the prohibitions set forth in this Ordinance.
- (2) The person, entity or organization is engaged or has engaged in any fraudulent scheme, device or trick in any place in the Township to obtain money or other valuable things, or is aiding or abetting any person engaged in such scheme, device or trick.

Section 21. Nuisance Per Se

Any violation of this ordinance is deemed to be a nuisance per se.

Section 22. Penalties

22.1 Upon discovering a violation of this ordinance, the Clerk shall notify the violator orally or in writing by means of first class letter. Such notice shall give up to 5 calendar days for the violation to be abated or a civil infraction shall be issued.

No further notification is required for subsequent violations in a three year period.

- 22.2 Any person violating any provision of this Ordinance shall be deemed responsible for a civil infraction. Penalties may be imposed as set forth in Ordinance 162 as amended, the Charter Township of Superior Civil Infraction Penalty Ordinance and Ordinance 137 Superior Township Municipal Civil Infractions Ordinance.
- 22.3 In addition to pursuing a municipal civil infraction proceeding, the Township may also initiate an appropriate action in a court of competent jurisdiction seeking injunctive, declaratory, or other equitable relief to enforce or interpret this Ordinance or any provision of the Ordinance.
- 22.4 All remedies available to the Township under this Ordinance and Michigan law shall be deemed to be cumulative and not exclusive.
- 22.5 Any person, firm or entity that assists with or enables the violation of this Ordinance shall be responsible for aiding and abetting, and shall be considered to have violated the provision of this Ordinance involved for which such aiding and abetting occurred. Furthermore, any attempt to violate this Ordinance shall be deemed a violation of the provision of this Ordinance involved as if the violation had been successful or completed.

Section 23. Severability

Should any section, subdivision, sentence, clause or phrase of this Ordinance be declared by the Courts to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any part thereof other than the part as invalidated.

Section 24. Publication

This Ordinance shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation as required by law.

Section 25. Repeal of conflicting ordinances

All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, including without limitation Ordinance 173 "Peddlers, Solicitors and Transient Merchants" are hereby repealed.

Section 26. Effective date.

This Ordinance shall take effect after publication in a newspaper of general circulation.
