John Copley, Township Resident and Cherry Hill Nature Preserve Park Steward, explained that this is basically the same grant application that was submitted last year. The application was not approved last year. Mr. Copley said the Parks Commission received information that the grant was not approved because the proposed project was not large enough and there was no handicap parking. This grant application includes handicap parking and an extension of the ADA trail as Phase 2 of the project. They have also secured additional letters of support from the Superior Woods senior citizens center, the Center for Independent Living and others. The total required grant match is \$38,000. A portion of the match will be provided thru in-kind donation of services. The actual cash required for the match will be in the area of \$21,000, which the Parks Commission will provide.

B. CONTRACT FOR ROADSIDE TRASH COLLECTION

The Township has an ongoing problem with people dumping trash in the rural area of the Township and has been attempting to hire someone to pickup trash on an as-needed basis. The Township has contracted with Mr. Charles Swanson to mow the lawn in the side street maintenance area. Mr. Swanson has done an excellent job and is a Township resident. He proposed contracting with his associate, Mr. Robert Butler, who is also a

Township resident, to pickup roadside trash. The Township presented an agreement to hire Mr. Robert Butler as an independent contractor at the rate of \$11.00 per hour. Mr. Butler will not be covered by any Township benefits and will be responsible for providing his own liability and vehicle insurance as well as pay for all costs related to the operation of his vehicle. The Township will pay for all dumping costs.

It was moved by Lewis, seconded by Williams, to approve the hiring of Mr. Robert Butler under as an independent contractor to pickup roadside trash. He will be hired under the terms of the independent contractor agreement, which requires the signature of both parties.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN SUPERIOR TOWNSHIP AND ROBERT BUTLER

This agreement made this _____ day of ______, 20____ by and between the Charter Township of Superior, hereafter referred to as the Township and Robert Butler, hereafter referred to as the contractor.

Whereas the Township desires to secure the services of a contactor for the purpose of:

Collecting trash roadsides and transporting it to an agreed upon recycle site.

Now, therefore, in consideration of the promises and covenants hereinafter contained, the parties hereto mutually agree as follows:

1. The relationship of the contractor to the Township is and shall continue to be that of an independent contractor and no liability of benefits such as Worker's Compensation, Pension, Health Insurance, unemployment benefits or other rights or liabilities arising out of or related to a contract for hire or employee/employer relationship shall arise or accrue to either party as a result of the performance of this contract.

2. The contractor shall maintain a proper driver's license and vehicle insurance while working as a contractor for the Township and provide proof of both to the Township.

3. The contractor shall perform the following duties:

a. Pick up trash as requested by the Township Supervisor, Clerk or Treasurer. Contractor may also pick up items he sees en route to picking up items requested by the Township Officials as long as he documents these pick-ups on his reports. b. Document the items picked up, date, and location on the Roadside Trash Pick-Up Report form provided along with the hours worked.

c. Contractor shall take items to either the Ypsilanti Township Compost site or Arbor Hills Compost Site. The Township has a charge account at the Ypsilanti site. If items are taken to the Arbor Hills site, contractor must pay the fee and then submit the invoice from the Arbor Hills site to the Township Accountant for reimbursement with the regular invoice.

d. Contractor shall invoice the Township with the form provided, no more than every two weeks. Invoices should be given to the Township Accountant.

4. The Township shall pay the contractor: \$11.00/hour

5. Payment shall be made according to the following payment schedule:

Within four business days of receiving invoice.

6. This contract may be terminated with ten days notice by either party.
