Springhill Nature Preserve

3260 Berry Road, Superior Township, Michigan 48198



Donors Nancy and Bradford Perkins established the Springhill Nature Preserve in 1991, with the assistance of the Superior Land Conservancy, then a local chapter of the Southeast Michigan Land Conservancy. The preserve consists of 30 acres of cattail and buttonbush swamp, mature beech/maple/oak woods, and an ancient apple orchard, and shares a small lake with the 160-acre Kosch-Headwaters

Preserve. The swamp hosts a hearty population of spring frogs and a wide variety of waterfowl, while the woods are frequented by deer, foxes, owls, hawks, and coyotes.

The primary purpose of the preserve is the conservation of wildlife habitat, while allowing for limited passive use by humans.

To get here from the Superior Township Hall (3040 N. Prospect Rd.):

Turn RIGHT (north) on Prospect Rd. (0.9 mile)

Turn RIGHT (east) on Ford Rd. (0.7 mile)

Turn RIGHT (south) on Berry Rd. (0.5 mile)

Or

Turn LEFT (south) on Prospect Rd. (276 feet)

Turn LEFT (east) on Cherry Hill Rd. (0.7 mile)

Turn LEFT (north) on Berry Rd. (0.5 mile)

Park on either side of the road; Springhill Nature Preserve is on the west side of Berry Road.

Park Hours:

Daily, dawn to dusk
