6. <u>CITIZEN PARTICIPATION</u>

- Nahid Sanii-Yahyai submitted a resolution to recognize elected officials who have served 20 or more years with Superior Township.
- Michelle Deatrick, Washtenaw County Commissioner, informed the board about the status of rapid transit in Macomb County, Oakland County, Washtenaw County and Wayne County. Macomb and Oakland have decided to pull out of negotiations. The Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners approved a measure directing Regional Transit Authority (RTA) board members, Alma Wheeler Smith and Elizabeth Gerber, to

negotiate with Wayne County and the City of Detroit to see if bus service and rail service could be increased between the municipalities. They will report back to the Board of Commissioners in June. The commission hopes to get a RTA millage on the ballot for November 2018.

- Bernedia Word, owner of Glemps Printing, expressed interest in printing the township newsletter, Superior Scenes.
- Trustee Green suggested creating a resolution to honor the 50th anniversary of the Southeast Michigan Council of Governments (SEMCOG).

7. PRESENTATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

• Jonathan Pelukas, Environmental Program Coordinator, with the Washtenaw County Public Works/Solid Waste department discussed the Washtenaw County Solid Waste Management Plan 2017 Amendment. Every county in the state of Michigan is required to have a solid waste management plan. The current landfill that Washtenaw County uses is the Arbor Hills landfill located in Salem Township at 6 Mile and Napier Rd. The county has 17 years of capacity at the site. So, there was not a need to open up the plan. Advanced Disposal, who operates the Arbor Hills landfill, requested that the county open up the plan because they had designs on potentially asking for an expansion of the landfill. The county started working on the plan in 2015. The expansion plans were met with resistance from the surrounding communities and the plans were scrapped. The county continued to work on the plan since portions of the plan were out of date. The county would like to get approval for the plan amendment from local units of government by May 2018.

- Dixboro Village Green, LLC is proposing a pavilion on the north side of the Freeman one room schoolhouse. The supervisor reached out to Bill Ford Jr. asking that if he was going to donate to the township in 2018 that it could go towards the pavilion. Mr. Ford donated \$15,000.00. The funds will cover architectural costs and a portion of the construction costs.
