

COMMITTEE TO PROMOTE SUPERIOR TOWNSHIP – “One Superior Place” Meeting May 16, 2018

Remarks and Announcements – Brenda Baker and Carla Bisaro attended; regrets were received from Ken Schmidt and Nancy Caviston. Brenda and Carla discussed the recent call from resident Erma Golden and her request for information. Ms. Golden is a local real estate agent interested in community contact.

Library Display/Bookmarks/Superior Places Binders – Carla reported that she had placed the Humane Society poster at the library for the month of May. The June selection is not yet determined. The supply of bookmarks at the Township lobby is well stocked, and all the Superior Places binders are current and up to date.

Internet/Website – There was little discussion of this subject. Carla mentioned that she had intended to check the site for information about the closing of Prospect Road north of Ford Road, but had not gotten around to doing it. Brenda had not had an occasion to need information from the Township website.

Superior Places – There have been no new descriptions written about Superior Places, but all of the current nominations remain viable. There has been noticeable activity at the Superior Feed site, so it may be opening soon and ready for a descriptive page. Huron Valley Nighthawks Motorcycle Club, MacArthur Boulevard, and Equine Life topics remain on the agenda. Recent information from Washtenaw County Parks indicates that the Michigan Folk School is preparing for operation at the Plymouth Road location, and so will operate in conjunction with the Staebler Farm. There has been no activity on the topic of Birds and Bird Watching within the Township. In relation to the coverage of Business in the Township, Carla mentioned the unusual sculptures displayed at a yoga studio on Plymouth Road – statues of an elephant and a blue giraffe.

Events, Outreach and Community Pride – Staffing for Superior Day was confirmed, and Carla supplied a sample of the sunflower seed planting and other displays to attract the public’s attention. We have a good supply of the “Where Do You Live?” flyers in the Township Hall vestibule, and we will also post that flyer at the Dixboro Farmers Market shortly after it opens at the end of May. There has been no activity on the welcome packet or the Township marquee. Carla reported that she was unwilling to proceed with the bike ride project after failing to find the help she needed to proceed. If contact with Erma Golden can be furthered, the use of the Superior Places descriptions by real estate agents could be explored.

Committee Development – The notion to question attendees of the Superior Day event about their feelings concerning life in the Township was again touched upon, so that we could use their responses for our contribution to the Fall *Superior Scenes*.
