

Staebler Farm County Park

7734 Plymouth Road, Superior Township, MI 48198



The Staebler Farm has long been a Township landmark on Plymouth Road. The purchase of the farm by the Washtenaw County Parks and Recreation Commission will help to preserve this operating farm for residents of Superior

Township and Washtenaw County. The Commission has restored the barns and farm buildings in order to operate the farm as a living museum and interpretive center. The farmhouse and chicken coop repair projects are nearing completion. This project coincided with work undertaken by the Michigan Folk School to rehabilitate the workshop to provide space for blacksmithing and woodworking. The 87-acre site includes a pond and two lakes, along with the historic frame barn built in the 1820s and a gambrel-roof barn built in 1922. This bit of Superior Township history will be preserved for future generations.

In late 2018, crews began constructing the parking lot on the south side of Plymouth Road to accommodate Michigan Folk School classes and other amenities. The gravel lot, a mowed trail, roadway enhancements, and lot paving will occur in the spring of 2019, as design development begins for the north portion of the park, including recreation amenities and landscape improvements.

To get here from the Superior Township Hall (3040 N. Prospect Rd.):

Turn RIGHT (north) on Prospect Rd. (2.1 miles)

Turn RIGHT (east) on Plymouth Rd. (0.3 mile)

The farm is on the LEFT (north) side of Plymouth Road.
