Proposed Minutes

1. Call to Order

Chair Paula Jefferson called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm.

Roll Call

Park Commissioners present: Paula Jefferson, Marion Morris, Bernedia Word, Sandi Lopez, Nahid Sanii-Yahyai, Martha Kern-Boprie

Park Commissioners absent: Terry Lee Lansing

Others present: Trustee Alex Williams, Juan Bradford, Park Administrator; Patrick Pigott, Recreation Coordinator; Ellen Kurath

3. Flag Salute

Chair Paula Jefferson led those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

4. Agenda Approval

It was moved by Marion Morris and supported by Nahid Sanii-Yahyai to approve the agenda as drafted. The motion carried.

5. Prior Meeting Minutes Approval

A. June 24, 2019

It was moved by Sandi Lopez and supported by Nahid Sanii-Yahyai to approve the minutes of 6/24/19 as presented. The motion carried.

6. Citizen Participation

Ellen Kurath addressed the Park Commission about the presence of invasive plants she noted during recent visits to township parks, particularly Schroeter and Schock parks.

Schroeter Park: "Stick-Tites" are nor present now. Garlic Mustard presence has decreased. "Stick-Tites" are a biennial plant, and may be more present next year.

Schock Park: "Wild Parsnip" is present and expanding. This plant is extremely irritating to the skin, and may cause painful blisters that take a year or more to heal. Ellen is noting locations where Wild Parsnip is found. Ellen, park commissioners and staff discussed methods to decrease the presence of Wild Parsnip, in particular herbicide versus cutting and bagging plants. While working around this plant, be sure to completely cover all skin that may contact the plant. After working around Wild Parsnip, be sure to wash all skin, clothing, tools and equipment contacted by Wild Parsnip plants.

7. Reports

A. Chairperson

Chair Paula Jefferson commented that the movie night in Dixboro Green on July 13 went well. Approximately 125 people attended, which was good for the first time this event was held in Dixboro.

B. Administrator

Juan Bradford submitted a written report. Marion Morris requested that decisions about trees to plant in Schock Park be placed on the August Park Commission agenda.

C. Township Board Liaison

Trustee Alex Williams reported on the July 15 township board meeting. Ellen Kurath provided history on the Clark Road Pump Station. SEMCOG dues were paid, and water rates for Superior Township customers of the Ann Arbor water system were amended. The entire meeting lasted six minutes.

D. Board Meeting Attendee

Martha Kern-Boprie was assigned to attend the 7/15/19 meeting, and forgot to attend. Sandi Lopez was present, and had nothing to add to Trustee Williams' report.

Nothing derails great times in the great outdoors like a runin with stinging nettles, poison ivy and poison oak. According to Dr. Watkins, no matter the type of plant, prevention is key.

"Wear full-length clothing to avoid contact with plants," suggests Dr. Watkins. "Barrier creams such as bentoquatam can also be applied prior to exposure to prevent the development of dermatitis." However, Dr. Watkins does caution. "It must be reapplied every 4 hours and leaves a clay residue that may be undesirable to some."

STINGING NETTLES

Identification: The stinging nettle is a long, tall stalk with hairs on its stem. It also features drooping, catkin flowers and oval, toothed leaves.

Interaction and Reaction: When touched, the spicules on the plant (also known as the hairs) cause a stinging or burning sensation and can manifest as raised bumps or hives. While it doesn't truly sting, it certainly feels that way.

Treatment: "Allow affected areas to dry and then gently wash with soap and water," instructs Dr. Watkins. Surprisingly, it's easier to remove spicules when dry. "Avoid heat or warm compresses as this will cause further irritation." A combination of topical, anti-inflammatory creams and oral antihistamines can provide relief from the stinging sensation.




POISON IVY

Identification: The telltale sign of poison ivy? A cluster of three leaves with pointed tips. Just remember, if it has leaves of three, let it be! Depending on the season, this plant can be reddish, green or even yellow-orange.

Interaction and Reaction: Poison ivy secretes an oil called urushiol, which causes the itchy rash associated with this pesky plant. Contrary to popular belief, it actually takes up to 24 hours for a reaction to surface. However, direct contact isn't the only way to experience "a brush" with urushiol. Burning poison ivy also releases gas that can cause lung irritation if inhaled.

Treatment: "The first step to getting rid of the rash is washing the affected areas with soap and water and scrubbing under nails to remove any resin," says Dr. Watkins. Also wash any clothes that may have been contaminated. Did your dog join you on the hike? Use gloves and give pets a thorough scrub, too.

The one thing you shouldn't do? Scratch. "Scratching affected areas could break the skin and cause an infection," Dr. Watkins cautions. Not to mention, it could reintroduce the oil to other places.




POISON OAK

Identification: Unlike poison ivy, poison oak doesn't always grow in clusters of three. Instead, look for scalloped (wavy) leaves that have rounded tips (much like its namesake the oak leaf). The color changes with the seasons: bright green in spring, yellow-green or pink in summer and yellow-brown in fall.

Interaction and Reaction: Poison oak also contains the irritating urushiol oil. "The rash usually develops 4-96 hours after exposure," says Dr. Watkins. "The rash or associated blister are not contagious." Wash affected areas and any clothing that may be contaminated — and don't scratch.

Treatment: "Topical treatments can be helpful to reduce the irritation and itch," explains Dr. Watkins. "Products containing menthol and phenol (calamine lotion) and astringents such as aluminum acetate can help." Hydrocortisone (a topical steroid cream) is also beneficial. A cool soak with an oatmeal-based bath product can help relieve itching. Or, try placing cool compresses on the affected areas for 15-30-minute intervals throughout the day. If untreated, the rash should resolve in approximately 3 weeks. If it persists or continues spreading to other areas, it should be evaluated by a medical professional.
