### 1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Charter Township of Superior Board was called to order by the Supervisor Ken Schwartz at 7:07 p.m. on May 18, 2020 on a Zoom Virtual Board Meeting.

### 2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Schwartz led the assembly in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

### 3. ROLL CALL

The members present were Nancy Caviston, Lynette Findley, Meghan Winslow, Lisa Lewis, Brenda McKinney, Ken Schwartz, and Alex Williams.

Absent: None

Supervisor Schwartz read an electronic message pursuant to the executive order.

### 4. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

It was moved by McKinney supported by Lewis, to adopt the agenda.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

### 5. APPROVAL OF MINUTES

### A. REGULAR MEETING OF MARCH 16, 2020

It was moved by McKinney supported by Williams, to approve the minutes of the regular Board meeting of March 16, 2020 as presented.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

### 6. <u>CITIZEN PARTICIPATION</u>

### A. <u>CITIZEN COMMENTS</u>

Brenda Baker wanted to make sure that the public was able to be heard during the meeting.

### 7. PRESENTATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

George Tsakoff OHM made a presentation on the Stamford Road sewer break. In the late part of March, early April, there was a sewer collapse along the 36' sanitary sewer on Stamford, east of Dawn Road. From Dawn Road to the east over to Wiard then back down to Clark Road there is a stretch of several thousand feet of 36' sanitary sewer interceptor and one portion of the sewer did collapse in late March. Ricky Harding initiated an emergency contractor to come out to the site and begin excavating down to make the repair. To give a little bit of a background, certain areas of this pipe are extremely deep, an excess of 20 feet. There is also a lot of ground water in that area and the soil is not very conducive to dewatering or stability. The soils are very silty especially down at the elevation of the pipe which is about 22 feet deep. The issue with that is when the contractor tried to do some local dewatering by putting pumps down in the trench, they immediately became clogged. It became a very difficult operation as far as getting the water under control at the pipe level. From that time, we have had a dewatering contractor on site. They have installed several deep wells around the collapse and the excavation to try to get the ground water level lower. It has been very difficult due to the soils. It has been a very slow process. The contractor has been dewatering for about six weeks, and they are not able to make the repair safely. The main thing we do not want to happen is have the contractor excavate too deep under the pipe and then start losing other sections of the pipe. They are going about that very carefully. It has been a very challenging excavation.

The contractor is bypass pumping. There have not been any residents affected by the sewage collapse. They are going to an upstream manhole, bypassing the collapse, to the downstream manhole; that is the continuation of the sewage flow during the collapse. The dewatering is separate from the bypass pumping. Dewatering is done with deep wells that are sunk down 40-50 feet to get into the clay level. Those pumps are trying to lower the aquafer level (water level) to make the repair. The challenge over the last six weeks or more has been trying to get the water level low enough, so the contractor can make the repair. They have made some progress, a contractor that did some grouting with a polymer (chemical grout). They are using that to inject it around the existing manhole to stop some of the water infiltration coming into the manhole. Later this week, they are going to try some of the grouting injection to stop some of the water that is flowing underneath the existing pipe where the collapse is. From the existing construction you have stone surrounding the existing pipe, a lot of that ground water is flowing right through the stone and flowing right into the excavation which is making it almost impossible for them to make the repair. The goal is to try to do some grouting in those areas to try to seal up that area around the existing pipe. We are hoping this will allow them to make the repair within the next couple weeks. This is an overview of the collapse.

They are looking at about 100 feet of pipe that needs to be replaced once they can make the excavation completely. This is an extensive repair, and it is unfortunate because of the soil conditions and ground water conditions.

Treasurer McKinney asked George if OHM knew that there was a soil problem at the time of the 36' pipe being replaced in 2002. George responded that it is his understanding that they knew that the soil and ground water was challenging. Some background on the 36' pipe, it is called an A2020 PVC pipe. When you are using a PVC pipe especially at deeper depths it is very important that when it is installed, it is installed with proper bedding, proper backfill around bottom and sides of the pipe, compaction of the stone is very important, so that is definitely an important aspect of the installation. George states that he is sure there were a lot of engineering considerations when they were making that decision.

Treasurer McKinney stated that the financing was a bond that Superior Township has 70% and Ypsilanti Township has 30%. George noted that they have started to video the other lengths of the 36' pipe. They have been coordinating with Ricky who has had a contractor videoing all the 36' pipe. There are other locations in the video where it appears to be becoming egg shaped instead of perfectly round. There are a few other areas that are concerning. We are recommending that we do some emergency lining work to try to get a liner in a few of these sewer runs where we are seeing some change in the pipe to avoid another collapse in another location. The bid from Granite inliner is on the agenda for later tonight. George showed a photo from one of the videos on the pipe. What we suspect is happening is the pipe is losing its lateral support on each side and it is compressing. At the top of the photo, there is a buckling starting. We have seen that in a couple of the other sewer runs which is why we are recommending the lining. Trustee Williams asked if they are adding a smaller sewer pipe inside this one. George explained that is it not necessarily a slip lining, it is more of a cured in place liner. It will take up some of the interior volume but not much. It is cured in place with hot water or steam. It is a fiberglass type liner, not PVC, and provides structural support.

Supervisor Schwartz explains that if you go upstream 100 feet from the sewer collapse towards Cheney School there is the Foster Creek that crosses the road. That is impacting this because there is a lot of water in that drain. That drain has some access through voids and cavities to the sewer line. Some of that water (ground and surface) is hitting down in that area using the stone as a conveyance for the water and bringing it into the trench. The chemical that they put in through the manhole is like a foam. This chemical expands around 30 times the size of the fluid and gets rock hard which will help seal off all the water coming in through the drain.

Trustee Caviston asked George what year it was when this pipe was put in. Supervisor Schwartz stated that it was in 2002. Trustee Caviston mentions her concern with the actual product. Supervisor Schwartz informs the board that he has made an insurance claim. Supervisor Schwartz states that we will have to look at how much does this cost us, how much of our reserves is being drawn down, and whether or not we will have to increase sewer rates to help make up for the loss. We will not get to that until we have a complete evaluation physically, engineering, and financially. As of right now, there are no health and safety issues.

### 8. <u>REPORTS</u>

### A. SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Schwartz reported on the following:

- The residents have been surprisingly very understanding and no one has been nasty even when we had to stop the recycling and compost pick up. People understood that the Covid-19 virus went through the workforce at Republic. The residents have been very supportive of everything and want to thank the fire department, police department, and utility department. They understand that these are essential workers. Jeff Kujawa, a Superior Township firefighter, tested positive for Covid-19 and had to take a month off, but he is back to work now and feeling well. A few other firefighters tested positive for the antibodies and felt sick for a while, but all seem to have come through it.
- Nancy Mason has been keeping up with all the financials. Lynette's people have been coming in from time to time to deal with absentee voters. Brenda's people have been coming in from time to time to work on deposits. Rick Mayernik has been full time since last week. Ricky Harding has been working hard on the sewer break. This sewer break is very time consuming. Mary Burton has kept the revenues and billing up. Social distancing and wearing masks have been implemented
- The insurance claim has been filed with Decker and Associates and it has been assigned to an adjuster. The meeting with the adjuster has not yet taken place. Supervisor Schwartz is still in the process of getting all the information together that they have requested. It may be that we have a claim for some of the damages.
- The Washtenaw County Road Commission has denied any financing for the improvements on Harris Road for the library that we requested. We are moving forward with the library site plan. Dave Guenther, chair of the planning commission, will call a special meeting to review the preliminary site plan as soon as we get the all clear on that. The library and Fairfax have been adjourned twice now due to the executive order. The board is going to be asked to approve an agreement with the Ypsilanti District Library to pay for the improvement on Harris Road with the intention that we will enter into a repayment agreement with a reasonable interest rate over a period of years that they will repay us. Everything with the library is up in the air right now.
- The pump station on Clark Road is moving along. Once all the bills are paid for the repair, we can then look at the revised balance sheet to see where we stand on the revenues in the reserve because we paid for the water line on McArthur out of the reserves. We will probably have to do a rates study and determine whether we must raise rates to help catch up. We do have the money to fix the sewer collapse, but it is going to be a big hit.
- AAATA has reduced our services back to one hour (each hour instead of each half hour). They are going to pro-rate the cost for March, April, and until full services are restored.

Washtenaw County Road Commission has extended the time to identify the projects
for this year. The Road Commission Local Road Program has been included as a
communication tonight. There was a meeting schedule, but they have canceled it
because of the virus. There is a very long list of improvements that we could choose
from for the projects for this year. Supervisor Schwartz would like to accommodate
the library and maybe another project.

# B. <u>DEPARTMENT REPORTS: BUILDING DEPARTMENT, FIRE DEPARTMENT, ORDINANCE OFFICER REPORT, PARKS COMMISSION MINUTES, SHERIFF'S REPORT</u>

It was moved by McKinney supported by Winslow, that the Superior Township Board receive all reports.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

Fire Chief informed the board that the medical control authority to Washtenaw and Livingston County tasked HVA to handle all the calls to reduce the risk of contamination amongst responders. The calls were screened, and the fire department would respond only if they were needed. HVA handled about 90% of the calls.

# A. <u>RESOLUTION 2020-10, THE PAYMENT FOR BILLS SUBMITTED BY STAMFORD</u> ROAD UTILITY REPAIR CONTRACTORS

Supervisor Schwartz explained that there are invoices from the various contractors for the sewer repair project. There are three invoices from Mersino Dewatering Inc. with a total amount of \$103,481 which is for the pumping, dewatering, and bypassing. Another invoice from D and D Water and Sewer Inc. with a total amount of \$210,026.86 which is for the digging, excavating, and all the safety measures being put in place. Advanced Underground Inspection invoice with a total amount of \$6,400 which was for the pipe video. The D and D Water and Sewer Inc. invoice was an overview, but Supervisor Schwartz would be happy to send anyone the whole invoice upon request. The crew is out there 24/7.

WHEREAS the sewer system has suffered a major collapse located on Stamford Road; and,

**WHEREAS** the Superior Township Utility Department is in the process of having the collapsed sewer main and inceptor repaired; and,

**WHEREAS** this main is our primary 36" sanitary transmission line that feeds into the YCUA sewer; and,

**WHEREAS**, although all repairs have not been completed, the Utility Department has received the following invoices for the work that has been done to date.

- Three invoices from Mersino Dewatering, Inc. in the amount of \$103,481.65
- One invoice from D&D Water and Sewer In. in the amount of \$210,026.86
- One invoice from Advanced Underground in the amount of \$6,400.00.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Superior Township Board of Trustees hereby approves the proposed invoices in the total amount of \$319,908.73 paid from the Utility Department reserves.

The resolution carried by unanimous vote.

### B. RESOLUTION 2020-11, GRANITE INLINER PROPOSAL

Supervisor Schwartz stated there might be additional in lining needed. George Tsakoff explained that this is a proactive measure. There are three sewer runs that were identified as being at higher risk due to the amount of deflection. This not only includes approximately 770 feet of lining of 36' pipe, it also includes three other spot liners that we may use in other areas that we see infiltration of water at the pipe joints. This also includes some grouting around several manholes. This does not include lining the area where the repair is being made. There is adequate funding in the reserves.

**WHEREAS**, the sewer system located on Stamford Rd. needs emergency rehabilitation on all three sections of the Wiard/Clark Interceptor: and,

**WHEREAS**, Granite inliner proposes to use Cured-in-Place-Pipe (CIPP) repair technology designed and installed for fully deteriorated pipe conditions,

WHEREAS, Granite inliner has included a pre and post closed-circuit television video (CCTV) inspection completed by Pipeline Assessment Certification Program (PACP), trained operators as part of the price.

WHEREAS, the estimated total of this repair is \$308,934.00. Prices include all labor, materials, and equipment to complete the preparation of the pipeline, install the Cured-in-Place-Pipe, reinstatement of lateral connections, bypass pumping and traffic control; and,

**WHEREAS,** Granite inliner has not made allowances for fees associated with obtaining traffic permits, the use of a water source (hydrant) or disposal of materials removed from the sewer during their operations.

**NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Superior Township Board of Trustees hereby approves the proposed invoice with Granite inliner dated May 11, 2020 in the amount of \$308,934.00 paid from the Capitol reserves.

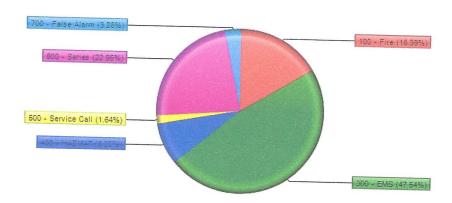

### Superior Charter Township Park Commission Regular Meeting February 24, 2020

### **Adopted Minutes**

### 1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order by Chair Paula Jefferson at 6:33 pm.

### Roll Call

Park Commissioners present: Paula Jefferson, Bernedia Word, Marion Morris, Terry Lee Lansing, Sandi Lopez, Martha Kern-Boprie, Nahid Sanii-Yahyai (arrived at 7:10 pm)

Park Commissioners absent: none

Others present: Juan Bradford, Park Administrator; Don Waligor; Ken Schwartz, Township Supervisor

### 3. Flag Salute

Chair Paula Jefferson led those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag.

### 4. Agenda Approval

It was moved by Marion Morris and supported by Terry Lee Lansing to approve the agenda as drafted. The motion carried.

### 5. Prior Meeting Minutes Approval

### A. January 27, 2020

It was moved by Sandi Lopez and supported by Marion Morris to approve the minutes of 1/27/20 as drafted. The motion carried.

### 6. Citizen Participation

Ken Schwartz addressed the Park Commission about an initiative by the Township Board to acquire the real estate presently owned by Rock Properties, and convey it to conservancy. The initiative involves collaboration between Superior Township, a local farmer, several land conservancies, and the Ann Arbor Greenbelt.

### 7. Reports

### A. Chairperson

Chair Paula Jefferson had no report.

### B. Administrator

Juan Bradford submitted a written report. He provided a further update on repair of the tennis courts in Community Park. Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds have been secured to fully repair the tennis court this year, at no cost to the Park Fund. Juan also informed Park Commissioners that a representative of a platform tennis group in Dixboro approached Juan about collaborating on installation of a platform tennis facility. Currently discussion is only on the broad concepts of collaboration. Park Commissioners requested more detail on the proposal.

### C. Board Liaison

No report because Trustee Alex Williams was away on business travel.

### D. Board Meeting Attendee

Sandi Lopez attended the February Township Board meeting. Movement is happening on the initiative to acquire the Rock properties. A letter was received by Superior Township from a lawyer

involved in the proposed sewer from Salem Township. Superior Township responded to the letter. Ordinance #169 was adopted, which makes it unlawful to discharge water into Superior Township without approval from the township board.

### E. Park Steward

No report.

### F. Safety

Don Waligor reported there have been no accidents or injuries in the past month.

### 8. Communications

It was moved by Marion Morris and supported by Terry Lee Lansing to receive the Communications. The motion carried.

### 9. Old Business

### A. Schock Park Memo

Park Commissioners discussed the draft text of a memo to the township board from the Park Commission concerning proposed changes to Schock Park. Bernedia Word commented that all park properties are owned by the township and asked what the Schock Park subcommittee was trying to accomplish with its proposals. Martha Kern-Boprie responded that the subcommittee was attempting to retain access to the park maintenance barn, shed and Old Township Hall, and leveraging this change to secure funding for maintenance work performed by Park Department staff on non-park properties.

Marion Morris suggested several text amendments to the memo. These amendments impact paragraph #3 and #5.

Paragraph #3

Current text:

Subcommittee members noted that Schock Park property is not presently used for park purposes, and given its location, is not likely to be used for recreation. They could see merit to turning Schock Park property over to the township board to maintain. The subcommittee noted concerns they want addressed before recommending changes to Schock Park.

Marion's Amended text: (amendments highlighted in yellow)

Subcommittee members noted that Schock Park property is not presently used for active park purposes, and given its location, has only been used for passive recreation, most often by town hall staff. They could see merit to turning Schock Park property over to the township board to maintain. The subcommittee noted concerns they want addressed before recommending changes to Schock Park.

### Paragraph #5

Current text:

1. Park Staff do a good job maintaining non-park properties, and this should continue. However, the Park Fund should be compensated for the labor spent maintaining non-park properties. This could take the form of charging hours to General Fund accounts, or by increasing the budget allocation to the Park Fund. \$5,000 per year would go a long way toward improving our parks, such as providing barrier-free sidewalks in them.

Marion's Amended text: (amendments highlighted in yellow)

1. Park Staff do a good job maintaining non-park properties, and this should continue. However, the Park Fund should be compensated for the labor spent maintaining non-park properties. This could take the form of charging hours to General Fund accounts.

### Current text:

2. Subcommittee members also noted that the Park Maintenance Barn sits on Schock Park, and Access to this structure should be continued and limited to Park Department staff.

Marion's Amended text: (amendments highlighted in yellow)

Subcommittee members also noted that the Park Maintenance Barn, park garage and Old
 Township Hall sit on Schock Park, and access to these structures should be continued and limited to Park Department staff.

### Current text:

3. The Park Commission wishes to know what the Township Board plans to do with the property that composes Schock Park.

Marion's Amended text: (amendments highlighted in yellow)

3. The Park Commission wants to know what the Township Board plans to do with the property that composes Schock Park.

Martha Kern-Boprie moved and Nahid Sanii-Yahyai supported a motion to direct the Park Administrator to meet with the Township Supervisor to discuss Park Commission concerns with access to Park structures in Schock Park and budgetary concerns about maintaining non-park properties.

After discussion among park commissioners Martha and Nahid withdrew the motion. A consensus among park commissioners was to put the memo back on the March park commission agenda, to complete the text before sending the memo to the township board.

### 11. Bills for Payment

It was moved by Martha Kern-Boprie and supported by Paula Jefferson to approve payment of the bills totaling \$16,032.21. The motion carried.

### 12. Financial Statements

It was moved by Sandi Lopez and supported by Bernedia Word to receive the January 2020 financial statements. The motion carried.

During the month of May there were 405 calls for service. Deputies conducted 98 traffic stops during this time with 25 citations issued.

Noteworthy events in Superior Township during last month include:

- **20-27326** (05/01/2020) Deputies Mercure/Mullen responded to the 5800 block of Meadow Drive for a death investigation involving a 23 year old male. There are no signs of foul play.
- 20-27473 (05/02/2020) Deputies Mullen/Mercure were sent to the 8900 block of MacArthur Blvd for a home invasion. Victim returned home and discovered TV/PlayStation/laptop missing and rear door kicked in. No suspects.
- 20-28056 (05/05/2020) Deputy Gorney responded to a recovered stolen vehicle (unoccupied) in the 1300 block of Stamford. The vehicle had been reported stolen from Ypsilanti Township earlier that morning. No suspects at this time.
- 20-28344 (05/07/2020) Deputy McGrady is investigating a robbery that was reported by UPS Security involving one of their delivery drivers. The victim/driver was sorting parcels in the back of his truck while stopped in the area of Abigail Dr/Hunters Creek Dr (Geddes/Prospect). A black male startled the driver when he entered the back of the UPS truck requesting a package he ordered (cell phone sent to a bogus address). Driver/victim asks him to exit truck and requests the suspect's identification. The suspect advised he didn't have ID and attempted to snatch the package from the UPS employee. The suspect eventually got the package away and ran to a nearby vehicle. The victim was able to obtain a license plate number. The suspect/vehicle are not local to the area. This case is pending further investigation. One suspect has been identified and is pending prosecution.
- 20-28451 (05/07/2020) Deputies Woollams/Khattar were sent to the 9000 block of MacArthur Blvd for a fight in progress. One of the subjects involved had been previously

trespassed from the complex. When deputies attempted to arrest him, he resisted. He was eventually taken into custody and was charged with trespassing and resisting arrest.

- **20-29599** (05/14/2020) Deputy Ross handled a larceny of a delivered parcel from the 1500 block of Harvest Lane. The caller reported that USPS delivered an elliptical trainer to her residence. When she got home from work at 6:30pm, the package was missing. No suspects.
- 20-29781 (05/16/2020) Scarlet Oak Ct- a resident called 911 to report seeing several younger subjects walking into the woods and a few minutes later several shots fired in the woods. Deputies stopped a vehicle leaving the area that matched the description given by the caller. 7 subjects were detained (mostly juveniles) and a rifle confiscated; Pending prosecution.
- **20-30256** (05/18/2020) Deputy Ward handled a larceny of a construction trailer from the 8500 block of Avon Ct. The trailer was parked at a construction site. No suspects.
- **20-30606** (05/20/2020) Deputy Mercure handled a larceny from St Joe Hospital. The suspect had just been discharged from the hospital. The suspect was seen by security taking mail from one of the hospital mailboxes. He was detained on campus by security and turned over to Deputy Mercure. Pending prosecution.
- **20-31156** (05/22/2020) Deputy Farmer handled a sexual assault that occurred on 05/14/2020 in the 800 block of E Clark Rd. The victim met up with a male subject that she met on SnapChat. While at the location, she alleged that he sexually assaulted her. The suspect has been identified and the case is pending prosecution.
- 20-32769 (05/28/2020) Superior Twp Deputies were sent to the 8900 block of Oxford Dr for a home invasion in progress. The caller, a neighbor, said he was witnessing a subject kick in the garage door at his neighbor's house. He provided a description of the suspect who fled the scene in a vehicle. Deputy Howard located the vehicle and arrested the driver for home invasion. Suspect and victim knew each other.
- 20-33396 (05/31/2020) Deputies VanTuyl and McGrady were dispatched to the 1900 block of White Oak Ln for a suspicious person/man with a gun call. They arrived in the area and were unable to locate the subjects involved. The caller stated she witnessed two subjects exchange money for a backpack. After the money was exchanged, one of the subjects ran off quickly. It is likely that the buyer believed he was purchasing a firearm from the seller, as the backpack contained a cordless drill. The buyer chased the seller, dropping the backpack. Neither subject were located or identified.

**THIS AGREEMENT** made and entered into this 15<sup>th</sup> day of June 2020 by and between the Board of Superior Charter Township (the "Township") and the Board of Washtenaw County Road Commissioners (the "Road Commission").

WHEREAS, both parties desire improvements of local roads located within Superior Township; and

**WHEREAS**, included within their 2020 Annual Meeting report, the Road Commission has provided the Township with a list of proposed road improvement: and

WHEREAS, the Township has historically contributed funds to the Road Commission for improvement of the local roads; and

**NOW, THEREFORE,** the Township approves the Road Commission to complete following road improvement projects in 2020:

1. TOWNSHIP-WIDE LIMESTONE RESURFACING: work to include the application of 1,000 tons of 23a limestone with associated dust control on various local roads within the township. Locations to be determined by the Township Supervisor and District Foreman.

#### Estimated project cost: \$21,100.00

2. DEERING STREET, STEPHENS DRIVE TO MACARTHUR BOULEVARD: work to include milling the existing pavement, structure adjustments, the placement of 2' HMA resurfacing, ADA sidewalk upgrades, aggregate shoulders, and associated project restoration.

#### Estimated project cost: \$ 61,900.00

3. MOTT ROAD, RIDGE ROAD TO WAYNE COUNTY LINE: work to include sealcoating. This is the proposed township share project with Ypsilanti Township

Estimated total project cost: \$17,500.00

Estimated project cost to Superior Township: \$8,750.00

4. GALE ROAD, VREELAND ROAD TO PAVED APPROACH AT CHERRY HILL ROAD: work to include shaping the existing surface, the application of

4' (C.I.P.) of 23a limestone (approximately 2,200 tons) with associated dust control and project restoration.

Estimated project cost: \$46,400.00

**NOW, THERFORE,** the total cost of the road improvements is \$138,150.00. Estimated amount to be paid by Superior Township under this agreement during 2020 is \$78,767.47.

**NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED**, the township approves the Superior Township Supervisor to sign the necessary agreements to secure funds for the road improvements that will be debited from G.L. 466-866.

#### 2020 SUPERIOR TOWNSHIP SECOND AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT, made and entered into this 15th day of June, 2020, by and between the Township Board of Superior Township, Washtenaw County, parties of the first part and the Board of Washtenaw County Road Commissioners, parties of the second part.

WHEREAS, the parties of the first part desire that certain improvements be made upon the local roads in the Township of Superior, and

WHEREAS, proper authority is provided to the parties of the agreement under the provisions in Act 51 of Public Acts of 1951 as amended,

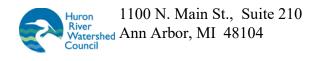
