The regular meeting of the Charter Township of Superior Board was called to order by the Supervisor Ken Schwartz at 7:01 p.m. on April 19, 2021 on a Zoom Virtual Board Meeting. Supervisor Schwartz read a script required by the Open Meetings Act.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Schwartz led the assembly in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

3. ROLL CALL

The members present were Supervisor Ken Schwartz, Clerk Lynette Findley, Treasurer Brenda McKinney, Trustee Nancy Caviston, Trustee Lisa Lewis, Trustee Bernice Lindke, and Trustee Rhonda McGill. All board members stated they were present in Superior Township.

4. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

It was moved by Treasurer McKinney supported by Trustee McGill, to adopt the agenda with the addition of adding: "H, Motion to Approve and Accept a Bid from Conklin Landscaping to Clean Up the West Side of Wiard Blvd".

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7. PRESENTATIONS AND PUBLIC HEARINGS

8. REPORTS

A. SUPERVISOR REPORT

Supervisor Schwartz reported on the following:

- The Special Meeting regarding the Salem Sewer Application is tomorrow at 3 p.m. and is suspected to have many public comments.
- Geddes Road is closed from the roundabout near Superior Road all the way to Dixboro Road. The Road Commission has been clearing the road right-of-way and replacing the guardrails. The Road Commission will be repaving the entire stretch which could take until May 15, 2021. This is being funded by the Michigan Department of Transportation Act 51 and Washtenaw County millage.
- Ford Road from Plymouth Rd to M-153 will be repaved before the height of the summer.
- There was a major gas outage in the Township last week. Arbor Woods and Geddes Ridge were both affected. A total of 615 customers were affected.
- The Library groundbreaking was last Wednesday. Clerk Findley and Supervisor Schwartz attended the title closing for the 4.2 acres conveyance to the Library.
- This summer, Supervisor Schwartz will be opening a bid for the back parking lot of the Township hall to be repaved and expanded due to the Sheriff's Department growth.
- Ron Peatry, Ordinance Officer, has decided to retire due to medical reasons. The Board made comments regarding how much they will miss Ron Peatry and how much he has done for the Township.
- Master Plan Committee will have a meeting coming up in May. The Planning Commission will have two representatives, Emily Dabish and Tom Brennan. The Board of Trustees will also have two representatives, Clerk Findley, and Trustee Lindke.

B. DEPARTMENT REPORTS: BUILDING DEPARTMENT, FIRE DEPARTMENT, ORDINANCE OFFICER REPORT, PARKS COMMISSION MINUTES, SHERIFF'S REPORT

It was moved by Trustee Lindke supported by Trustee McGill, that the Superior Township Board receive all reports.

The motion carried by unanimous vote.

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**TRUSTEE LINDKE LIAISON REPORT ON PARKS & RECREATION
COMMISSION MEETING**

During the March 22, 2021 Parks and Recreation Commission Meeting, Juan Bradford reported Washtenaw County will not fund the ADA compliant sidewalk in Community Park because the project was already in the budget. Juan wants to go ahead with the project. Trustee Lindke would like the Board to make a commitment to put the Schock Park Use and Maintenance on the next Board meeting agenda. Supervisor Schwartz commented he has been swamped but agrees to get this done. The Parks Maintenance Supervisor position was awarded to Patrick Pigott.

Supervisor Schwartz spoke with Teresa Gillotti and Tara Cohen and explained to them the ADA compliant sidewalk was not specifically mentioned in the budget. In the parks budget, it is stated there are funds for park improvements. The sidewalk project will be funded through the Washtenaw Community Development Block Grant Program this year. Juan Bradford will complete and submit the application by the end of the week.

9. COMMUNICATIONS

A. WASHTENAW URBAN COUNY COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATION

Supervisor Schwartz explained this grant is for additional lighting on MacArthur Blvd. in front of Sycamore Meadows and Danbury Green. This application has been submitted but has not been approved yet. This would be an agreement with DTE which would be presented to the Board. The County would pay for the installation, but the Township would be responsible for the usage. Two years ago, on MacArthur from Clark Rd to Stamford Rd, this was done on every other light pole.

The tennis courts at Community Park were funded last year through the Community Development Block Grant. Juan Bradford has accepted the bid on this project. Some of the funds will be rolled over for next year.

The Township will be looking at making some improvements at the cross walk at Harris Rd and MacArthur Blvd (not the mid-street crosswalk). The Washtenaw County Road Commission (WCRC) will begin a warrant study which will look at the pedestrian and motor traffic. Supervisor Schwartz has requested a three way stop sign at the MacArthur Blvd/Harris Rd intersection. All of this will be paid for by the WCRC. The WCRC will restripe MacArthur Blvd this year.

**B. TREASURER MCKINNEY ANNOUNCEMENT REGARDING DEPUTY
TREASURER**

Treasurer McKinney reported on hiring Trustee Lisa Lewis as her Deputy Treasurer beginning June 14, 2021 instead of July 1, 2021. Treasurer McKinney explained she needs Trustee Lewis to attend some trainings in May before her start date. Trustee Lewis will not

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receive any health benefits. The current Deputy Treasurer's end date will be June 14, 2021. Treasurer McKinney is asking for the Board's approval to hire Trustee Lewis starting June 14th.

Trustee Lindke explained she reached out to MTA about a Township Trustee performing work for the Township. The Board must approve the Trustee working for the Township. Trustee Lindke asked for transparency regarding who would be appointed Treasurer at the time of retirement of current Treasurer. The Board discussed that this was not what was being asked right now.

Supervisor Schwartz explained the process when a Board member resigns. Clerk Findley asked Trustee Lewis' plans are with her current employment position. Treasurer McKinney and Trustee Lewis' explained this was not something they wanted to discuss. Supervisor Schwartz suggested the Deputy Treasurer position be advertised. Clerk Findley stated she does not have to advertise for a deputy position. Treasurer McKinney also commented on not having to advertise for a deputy position. Trustee Lindke stated in a Township with a population of less than 40,000 if the Township Board agrees, a Township Trustee can perform non-statutory duties. Trustee Lindke explained she wants transparency for the Board which is one of the reasons she ran for Trustee.

It was moved by Trustee McGill, supported by Trustee Lindke to appoint Trustee Lewis as full-time Deputy Treasurer starting June 14, 2021 but allowing her to start training in May 2021 for an hourly wage for her training hours. On June 14, 2021, the current part-time Deputy Treasurer will no longer be working for the Township.

This program will allow Dispatch to automatically input the information in the report and will allow for more accurate reports. This is software.

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Superior Fire Department is requesting to move forward with the CAD integration for Dispatch Services.

WHEREAS, there are two parts to the request. 1) to approve the integration with ESO for the annual amount of \$1,495.00. ESO provides our Fire Reporting software to FEMA and the state of Michigan as required by law. The reason for this integration is presently all the Fire Department Staff have to manually write the information on all incident reports in the program software. By completing the integration of CAD from Dispatch, this will automatically autofill all the run times, truck, and narrative information from 911. Therefore, this information for the reporting system will be more accurate.

WHEREAS, 2) Fire Dispatch connection for CAD requires a one-time fee to install the connection to our tablets in all Fire Stations and Truck. The cost for the one-time fee is \$3,394.88 as stated in the attached email.


WHEREAS, both costs would come from line item #206-336-850-000 Dispatch Services.

WHEREAS, the Charter Township of Superior entered into a use agreement with the Dixboro Methodist Church giving control of the Green and the Schoolhouse to the Board of Trustees; and,

WHEREAS, the Township is desirous of rehabilitating the Schoolhouse and the Green; and,

WHEREAS, the Dixboro Village Green LLC requested a permit from the Washtenaw County Health Department for a well and private sewer permit; and,

WHEREAS, the Washtenaw County Health Department required numerous engineering and survey questions to be provided by a professional engineer before issuing a sewer permit; and,

WHEREAS, OHM supplied a proposal and a scope of services to Superior Township for the engineering for the sewer permit not to exceed the amount of \$8,700.00; and,


WHEREAS, Dixboro Village Green LLC has agreed to split the costs of the project 50/50.

C. RESOLUTION 2021-17, MORATORIUM ON REZONING PETITIONS

Supervisor Schwartz stated the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners has declared a state of emergency until December 31, 2021. The last WHEREAS clause is new in this resolution. “zoning issues of minor importance do not require the input of citizens to the same degree as large rezoning issues and where area plans amendments and revisions pursuant to 7.106 of the Superior Township Zoning ordinances do not require the same scrutiny or public input as projects which have a significant bearing on traffic, utilities, or other zoning considerations.” Some developments have gotten area plans approved during a public hearing but have never been executed on them. If the developments come in with some minor changes, they would not need to have another public hearing.

**RESOLUTION TO IMPOSE A TEMPORARY MORATORIUM ON REZONING
PETITIONS**

RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2021-17

DATE: APRIL 19, 2021

WHEREAS, the Michigan Zoning Enabling Act (Act 110 of 2006) provides for a statutory scheme for the consideration of proposed amendments to zoning ordinances and zoning maps; and,

WHEREAS, under the statute a township Board may require a public hearing (MCL 125.3401) on a request for amendment under the township zoning ordinance, and

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WHEREAS, the Washtenaw County Board of Commissioners has declared a state of emergency, county wide, until December 31, 2021, due to the covid-19 virus and its variants; and

WHEREAS, it is both impractical and unfair to the residents of the community for the Township to hold remote meetings on issues that are of great and significant public interest and which may have a permanent impact on the character and infrastructure of the community; and,

WHEREAS, the township has been informed by many citizens that virtual meetings are a poor substitute for in-person meetings; and that many residents are not equipped to join virtual meetings due to the lack of electronic and the other necessary components to fully participate in a virtual meeting; and,

WHEREAS, the township Board can take notice of the commonsense notion that for issues that may draw the interest of hundreds of citizens, a virtual public hearing denies the citizen to fully participate in the public hearing and can see and confront the issues at hand.


WHEREAS, zoning issues of minor importance do not require the input of citizens to the same degree as large rezoning issues and where area plans amendments and revisions pursuant to 7.106 of the Superior Township Zoning ordinances do not require the same scrutiny or public input as projects which have a significant bearing on traffic, utilities, or other zoning considerations.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT a moratorium is imposed upon holding any public hearing(s) on requested zoning amendments until July 20, 2021 or until such time as the Township Board believes it is safe to return to unlimited in-person meetings.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT area plans revisions and area plan amendments are not subject to this moratorium.

WHEREAS, it is prudent to reconsider the items on the pre-approval list from time to time;




WHEREAS, the Township has historically contributed funds to the Road Commission for improvement of the local roads.

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1. CALL TO ORDER

The regular meeting of the Charter Township of Superior Board was called to order by the Supervisor Ken Schwartz at 3:01 p.m. on April 20, 2021 on a Zoom Virtual Board Meeting. Supervisor Schwartz read a script required by the Open Meetings Act.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Supervisor Schwartz led the assembly in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

3. ROLL CALL

The members present were Supervisor Ken Schwartz, Clerk Lynette Findley, Treasurer Brenda McKinney, Trustee Nancy Caviston, Trustee Lisa Lewis, Trustee Bernice Lindke, and Trustee Rhonda McGill. All board members stated they were present in Superior Township.

Absent: None

4. ADOPTION OF AGENDA

It was moved by Treasurer McKinney supported by Trustee Lindke, to adopt the agenda.

The motion carried by unanimous voice vote.

5. PUBLIC COMMENTS (Limited to three minutes per person)

Supervisor Schwartz read a script required by the Open Meetings Act regarding Public Comment and/or Public Hearing.

- Michelle McIntyre, resident of Superior Township for eleven years in Woodside Village subdivision, voiced her concerns with the disruptions to the natural spaces the Salem sewer would bring about in the Township.
- Susan Rosegrant, resident of Superior Township on Prospect Road, shared her concerns with the disruptions the Salem sewer would bring to the bird population in the Township.
- Bill Secrest, resident of Superior Township for thirty-three years on Cherry Hill Road, shared his concerns with the Salem sewer regarding the preservation of mother nature.
- David Zelisse, third generation Superior Township farmer on Gotfredson Road, voiced his opposition of the Salem sewer application due to the proximity of the sewer and his farm.
- Reg Baker, Matthaei Farm Condominium resident, read a letter submitted by the Matthaei Farm Condominium Association.

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- Mary Weidel, Plymouth Township resident in Country Club Village for sixteen years, stated her concerns with the placement of the sewer and how it would change the surrounding communities. She voiced her concerns with the sewer availability and boom in development it would ignite.
- Bill Schikora, resident of Superior Township in Matthaai Farm, commented on the availability and capacity of connecting the Salem sewer to the Western Townships Utility Authority. Section 422 of the drain code requires the Washtenaw County Water Resources Commission's approval when any sewer crosses a county. Bill voiced his concerns regarding this.
- Supervisor Heise, Plymouth Township Supervisor, stated he and the residents of Plymouth Township's concerns with allowing the sewer to be put in and its effect on the quality of life. Salem Township does not have any of the social infrastructures which are needed to support a large-scale development. Plymouth Township is also opposed due to the 20 million dollars of state taxpayer money being used for this project which Plymouth Township had no hand in acquiring this. Supervisor Heise is the chairman of the Western Townships Utility Authority (WTUA). He stated pursuant to the bylaws, another community could not join WTUA without consent of the total board. The infrastructure to connect to the Detroit sewer system no longer exists. All the WTUA flow goes to the Ypsilanti Communities Utility Authority (YCUA) facility. There is a need for additional capacity in the WTUA. Plymouth Township is in opposition of the Salem Sewer application.
- John Copley, resident of Superior Township for forty-six years and served on the Planning Commission for twenty years, stated there is nothing to gain and everything to lose if the Salem sewer application is approved.
- Andrew Dettling, Canton Township resident, voiced his concerns with the Salem sewer regarding the rare bird species and bird watching. He does not want Superior Township to become another Canton.
- Mary Emmett, Superior Township resident, commented on the tremendous efforts of the Township to keep it with its' open spaces. She states her opposition to the Salem sewer application.
- John Rintamaki, Matthaai Farm Condominium resident for thirty years, voiced the support the Superior Township Growth Management Project of opposing the Salem sewer application.

7. NEW BUSINESS

A. REVIEW SALEM TOWNSHIP'S APPLICATION TO CONTRACT A SEWER IN A SUPERIOR TOWNSHIP RIGHT OF WAY

Mr. Edward Plato, attorney representing Salem Township, reported on the following:

- He informed Superior Township that Salem Township really wants to be a good neighbor and is willingly to do whatever it takes to eliminate the concerns of the residents. Mr. Plato provided the Township Board with background information on the project. Salem Township has set aside approximately 1,400 acres surrounding the M-14 and Gotfredson Road interchange for residential and commercial development called the Urban Service District. Salem's Master Plan requires the area be serviced by public water and sanitary sewage disposal. The State of Michigan through the Michigan Economic Development Corporation (MEDC) has awarded Salem Township \$20 million in grant funds to assist Salem Township in providing public water and sewer utilities to Salem's Urban Service District. This will stimulate economic growth and development opportunities within Salem Township. The public water service has been acquired through the Great Lakes Water Authority, and construction of the public water system is currently underway. The project is expected to be completed by the fall of 2021. The public sewer system will connect to the Ypsilanti Communities Utility Authority (YCUA). For YCUA to accept the wastewater from Salem Township, it requires running an underground sewer main in public road right-of-way under Gotfredson Road through Superior Township. Superior Township states in its' ordinances the local septic tanks, sewage disposal facilities, and onsite wastewater treatment plants will be detrimental to the health and safety of the residents of the Township.

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- Salem Township has investigated various alternatives to connect to public disposal systems including Plymouth Township, Lyon Township, Western Townships Utility Authority (WTUA), Wayne County, and YCUA. The reports of those efforts have been provided to Superior Township in the application. On July 1, 2017, Salem Township entered a water transportation and treatment agreement with YCUA. The necessary capacity for Salem Township has been reserved at YCUA through this agreement. In this agreement, Salem Township has exclusive ownership and control of the wastewater transportation including the pipeline running through Superior Township. No other YCUA community member including Superior Township would not be allowed to connect to this wastewater transportation system without Salem Township's approval. The Salem Township wastewater system has obtained the necessary approval from Washtenaw County, State of Michigan, and YCUA. The approval of these regulatory agencies will protect the environment, health, safety, and welfare of Superior Township residents. Salem Township is willing to take any necessary steps to ensure Superior Township that developers could not tap into this sewer line.
- The sewer line will be a force main which would make it very difficult for anyone to tap into this line. A force main sewer line is a pipeline which conveys under pressure from a pump or compressor in Salem Township to the discharge point at YCUA wastewater plant in Ypsilanti. Superior Township has similar sewage disposal in neighboring communities connect to YCUA. The sewer pipe has limited capacity and will only serve the Salem Urban Service District. Salem Township would be the owner of the sewer line. Both townships would enter into an agreement to never allow any landowner to tap into the sewer line. The consent judgment issued by the courts would not allow anyone to tap into this sewer line. This is an added protection. The Superior Township engineers have asked why Salem Township does not build an onsite wastewater treatment plant instead of seeking to run a sewer pipe through Superior Township. Running a sewer main through Superior Township was the only real feasible alternative.

Melissa Coatta, Hubbell, Roth & Clark Inc associate, reported on the following:

- She explained to the Board of Trustees some of the history of the sanitary sewer project. Lyon Township currently does not have any capacity at their wastewater treatment plant. Plymouth Township also has no spare capacity. WTUA does not have any surplus capacity for Salem Township. All three options were not viable options for Salem Township's Urban Service District.

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Brian Simons, Stantec Consulting, reported on the following:

- The wastewater treatment plant evaluation. Stantec Consulting reviewed constructing an onsite wastewater treatment plant but found out YCUA had spare capacity. All permits have been obtained.

Ish Naik, design engineer with Stantec Consulting, reported on the following:

- The sewer will be a force main sewer line. This would make it difficult to tap into in the future. There will be very few structures on the force main sewer to access primarily to allow bypass pumping in case of an emergency. The whole profile of the force main sewer system has been reviewed by the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, and Energy very closely.

Bruce Wallace, Schostak Brothers & Company Inc., reported on the following:

- Superior Township has the same intentions as Salem Township regarding preserving open spaces and environmental protection. Both Townships have the same ordinances. All the specialists and experts suggest allowing this force main sewer line instead of building another wastewater treatment plant will be best for the environment.

Supervisor Schwartz asked the Board of Trustees if anyone had any questions for Salem Township's representatives. There were no questions.

David Landry, attorney representing Charter Township of Superior, reported on the following:

- The standard which the Board of Trustees are to apply when making the decision to approve or deny the application. The standard is set forth in the Michigan Constitution, Michigan Statutory Law, and Superior Township ordinance. All three serve the same purpose. No one can construct a sewer line through the Township without the Township Board's consent. The Township Board must base their decision on rational reasons.
- Why is this request being made? Salem Township wants to increase development. They have created the Urban Service District and have invited developers to come into the Township to develop commercial and residential areas. Salem Springs LLC has entered a planned unit development (PUD) which will allow them to develop in the Urban Service District. The PUD agreement specifically states the Township is not financially responsible for bringing water or sewer into the Urban Sewer District. Salem Springs LLC would be responsible for this. Salem Springs LLC claims a public health emergency exists and the construction of the sewer pipe through Superior Township is the route.

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- Superior Township has provided the application with OHM Advisors and McKenna to review and advise the Township. The planning review by McKenna suggests Salem Township wants to construct the sewer line through the length of Superior Township. The proposed route is along Gotfredson Road which runs through the heart of the agricultural area. McKenna's report finds "the proposed construction would have serious consequences, thwarting the Township's efforts to preserve and protect its agricultural land and rural open space". Superior Township's master plan describes its residents' visions for the future of the Township. The residents have indicated in the master plan they want to retain a rural character in all of the Township but the southern edge with the bulk of the population living in developed areas south of Geddes Road and the historic hamlet of Dixboro. The land north of Geddes Road, outside of the hamlet of Dixboro, shall be preserved, managed, or developed in a manner that focuses on the long-term retention of agricultural operations, greenspace, and other rural land uses. McKenna notes 72.8% of the Township is maintained in rural land use. There are eight nature preserves in the Township.
- McKenna points out three main threats to agricultural use which include non-farm housing replace farms, incompatibility of non-farm housing being close to active agricultural, and increased property taxes which burdens farmers. Utilities result in urban development. Mr. Landry gave examples of surrounding Townships who have allowed utilities into their areas.
- Salem's master plan states "extension of public sewer services into designated agricultural zones shall be prohibited". McKenna reports, "Salem Township apparently recognizes the deleterious impact the utilities development cycle has on agricultural and rural open spaces. Nevertheless, Salem Township wants Superior Township to cast aside the same utilities and growth management strategy it has adopted and adhered to, just so it can develop its Urban Service District". The wish to provide sanitary sewer service to the Salem Township Urban Service District is by no means an emergency.
- The application was reviewed by OHM Advisors. They have concluded there is no public emergency, and this sewer line through Superior Township is not the only option. The entire sewer line would not be trenchless installation and would be 10 miles in length. OHM reports this would require a large amount of water for flushing. OHM asked where Salem Township proposes the water would come from. Odor issue from release valves is also an issue that has surfaced. OHM reports it is feasible for a small pump station to connect to a force main sewer. The contract Salem Township has with YCUA can be amended by either Salem Township or YCUA. OHM advises there are many feasible options for proposed utilities to the Urban Service District and lists them in their report. Both parties, Salem Springs LLC, and Salem Township, have agreed in writing that it is feasible to construct an onsite wastewater plant at the Urban Service District.

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Treasurer McKinney motioned to deny the Salem Township's application. The reason being the applicant has not established that it meets the criteria set forth in section 169-85 of Superior Township Ordinance No. 169. Specifically, there is no public health emergency set forth in the attached report from OHM. The proposed sewer line is not the only feasible way to avert a public health emergency or to provide sewer services to Salem Township's Urban Service District. Its operations and maintenance issues pose a threat to environmental risks to Superior Township as stated in the attached report from OHM. The existence of the proposed sanitary sewer force main creates a direct threat and is inconsistent to Superior Township's master plan goal of maintaining the land north of Geddes Road as agricultural rural open space as stated in the attached report from McKenna.

Trustee Lindke asked Edward Plato what the public health emergency is. Edward Plato explained there is a development with 554 house which needs to have sewage disposal treatment. The only feasible option is having the force main sewer line through Superior Township.

It was moved by Treasurer McKinney, supported by Trustee McGill to deny Salem Township's application to contract a sewer in a Superior Township right of way.

- Jay Gardner, resident, and vice chair of the Planning Commission of Superior Township, commented on supporting the action the Board of Trustees took on denying the Salem Township sewer application and question why the developer continued with development without having the sewer issue resolved.
- Jack Smiley, resident of Superior Township on Cherry Hill Road, thanked the Board of Trustees for their vote on denying this application.
- Bill Schikora, resident of Superior Township in Matthaehi Farm, commented on the report from Hubbell, Roth & Clark Inc.

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9. ADJOURNMENT

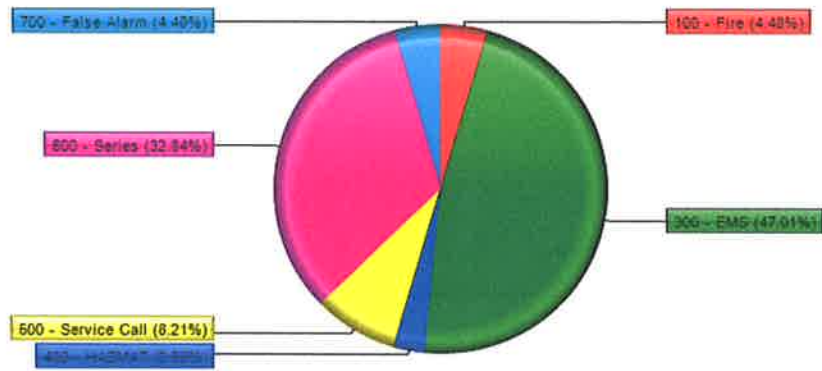

During the month of April there were 881 calls for service. Deputies conducted 286 traffic stops during this time with 24 citations issued and 1 drunk/drugged driving arrest.

Noteworthy events in Superior Township during last month include:

- 21-20889 (4/2/2021) Superior Twp deputies responded to the 1500 block of Ridge Rd after an unknown person called Metro Dispatch from a 911 only phone to report a shooting at the trailer park. Deputies checked the area but did not locate anyone or anything suspicious.
- 21-21473 (4/4/2021) Deputy VanderRoest was dispatched to the 1100 block of Clark Road regarding a possible arson. He met with the homeowner who had been out of town. When the owner returned home, he was informed by a neighbor, that there appeared to be fire damage on the backside of his garage. Superior Twp Fire responded to the scene as well. This case remains under investigation.
- 21-22605 (4/8/2021) At approximately 3pm, the Ypsilanti City Police were dispatched to Michigan Ave near Congress for a traffic crash. Upon arrival, they discovered that the at fault vehicle was being chased by a subject on a motorized scooter, was shooting at him. He further told Ypsilanti Police that the incident started on MacArthur Blvd. A suspect has been identified and arrested. This case is pending in court.
- 21-24293 (4/16/2021) Deputies responded to a report of a fight in progress and a shot being fired, in the 8800 block of MacArthur Blvd. Deputies spoke to several subjects, but all denied any knowledge of a fight or shot being fired. This case remains under investigation.

- 21-24477 (4/17/2021) Deputies were dispatched to a medical in the 9000 block of Gardner where they found a female adult unresponsive. Deputies rendered life-saving treatment, including the administration of Nalaxone. The victim regained consciousness and was transported to a local hospital for further medical treatment.
- 21-25149 (4/20/2021) Deputy Bland responded to the 8600 block of MacArthur Blvd for an indecent exposure. A suspect has been identified. This case remains under investigation.
- 21-26227 (04/28/2021) Deputies responded to a shooting in the 1500 block of Ridge Road. The victim sustained a non-life threatening gunshot wound to their leg and was transported to a local hospital. This case remains under investigation.
- 21-26991 (4/28/2021) Metro Dispatch received a call regarding a possible drunk driver in the area of Prospect and Cherry Hill. Deputy Bland located the vehicle and attempted to stop the vehicle but the driver fled. A pursuit ensued into Wayne County then back into Washtenaw County where the female driver was eventually captured and arrested for fleeing and OWI. This case is pending further investigation.
- 21-27691 (4/30/2021) Deputy Khattar and Deputy Farmer conducted a traffic stop on MacArthur Blvd. The driver pulled into one of the apartment complexes and refused to provide ID. He attempted to flee the stop, striking one of the deputies with his vehicle. Deputies pursued the suspect driver and apprehended him, following a short foot chase. This case is pending in court.

**RESOLUTION TO TRANSFER AUTHORITY OF SCHOCK PARK
TO CHARTER TOWNSHIP OF SUPERIOR BOARD OF TRUSTEES**

RESOLUTION NUMBER: 2021-20

DATE: MAY 17, 2021

WHEREAS, the property known as Schock Park, located on Cherry Hill Road, and legally described as set forth in the attached deed; and,

WHEREAS, it is the mutual decision of the Superior Township Parks & Recreation Commission and the Superior Township Board of Trustees to transfer authority for all purposes of the described land to the Board of Trustees; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent of the parties to abandon parklike activities on the site, and to use the site for governmental and institutional uses consistent with township government; and,

WHEREAS, upon the transfer of the described land the Board of Trustees agree to the following terms:

1. The Board of Trustees will remunerate the Parks & Recreation Commission budget for any maintenance performed on the former Schock Park at the usual wages paid to maintenance personnel for the hours that work was performed.

2. The Board of Trustees agrees to remunerate to Parks & Recreation Commission budget for any maintenance performed at the township's direction which is not park property at the usual wages paid to Park Maintenance personnel for the hours that work was performed.

3. The Parks & Recreation Administrator shall itemize the above costs and submit to the Township Supervisor the estimated costs of wages to be incurred for the following year by August 1st of each year to be added to the Parks and Recreation budget for the next year.

4. The Park Maintenance personnel may continue to use the structures on the former Schock Park for storage and maintenance activities until the township provides equal and comparable space elsewhere in the township.

5. The Township Board of Trustees shall notify the Parks & Recreation Commission of any improvements to the Park. This notice is advisory only and will not affect the plans of the Board of Trustees.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED THAT the Superior Township Board of Trustees agree to the above conditions.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the transfer shall occur upon the Parks & Recreation Commission acceptance of this resolution by a majority vote at a regular meeting of the Parks & Recreation Commission.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT the Parks & Recreation Administrator and the Township Supervisor shall meet to discuss adjustments to 2021 Parks and Recreation Budget for work to be performed in 2021 for non-park service areas.
