

Border to Border (B2B) Trail

The Border to Border Trail is envisioned to be a continuous 40-mile shared-use paved path for non-motorized use traversing Washtenaw County, from Livingston County to Wayne County, along the Huron River. The trail links the open spaces of the Huron River greenway, providing opportunities for transportation, recreation, and river access. The trail is being completed in 13 segments over a ten-year period. The completed segment in Superior Township runs

past Washtenaw Community College on Huron River Drive, and then wraps around the Trinity Health Ann Arbor Hospital complex on McAuley Drive. It also includes an unpaved path with a scenic observation deck.

Washtenaw County Parks has teamed up with the Huron Waterloo Pathways Initiative to expand the B2B to Dexter, Chelsea, Stockbridge and Pinckney in an effort to create a 70-mile continuous pathway in Washtenaw County, and in 2015 the B2B was incorporated into the State of Michigan's Iron Belle Trail, a 2000-mile-long trail that will ultimately connect Detroit's Belle Isle Park to Ironwood in the Upper Peninsula.

Bring your bike, roller blades, or walking shoes and enjoy your exploration!

To get here from the Superior Township Hall (3040 N. Prospect Rd.):

- Turn LEFT (south) on Prospect Rd. (2.1 miles)
- Turn RIGHT (west) on Geddes Rd. (1.8 miles)
- Turn LEFT (south) on Superior Rd. (1.2 miles)
- Turn RIGHT (west) on Huron River Dr. (0.5 miles)
- Turn RIGHT (north) on McAuley Dr. (0.7 miles)
