FROM OUR SUPERVISOR BY KENNETH SCHWARTZ, SUPERVISOR

In June of 2022 the Superior Charter Township Board approved an amendment to the area plan and development agreement between Superior Township and Hyundai Motor Company. The amendment permitted an expansion of the Hyundai American Technical Center located on the southwest corner of Geddes and Leforge Roads to add 98,600 square feet of new construction covering three separate buildings.

The first building is 58,000 square feet which will accommodate over 150 new employees in research and development in advanced electrical systems for automotive purposes, the development of hydrogen fuel cell research, and other advanced automotive components. The second building is a 38,300 square feet indoor automobile crash test facility and the equipment to measure various impacts to improve automobile safety. The third building is a small garage which will support the ¹/₄ mile outdoor test track. Vehicles will be driven on a strip at no more than 45 m.p.h. All new construction is based upon research, development, and improved safety.

ELECTION NEWS!!!

<u>What You Need to Know</u> as the 2024 election season approaches. It is critical for Michigan voters to understand the state of Michigan's newly adopted early voting and Absentee Voting rules. These rules ensure that all eligible Michigan voters can exercise their constitutional right to vote conveniently and securely. Please carefully read all the changes below. These changes incorporate all the election updates from the state of Michigan.

Early Voting Dates and Locations:

Early voting is a convenient option for those who prefer to cast their ballots before Election Day. In Michigan, early voting must be provided for each <u>statewide and federal election</u> for nine consecutive days. This period begins on the second Saturday before the election and ends on the Sunday just before the election day itself. It provides voters with ample time to participate in the electoral process at their convenience. In order to implement early voting, the Charter Township of Superior will be teaming up with the Washtenaw County Clerk's Office, along with 22 other jurisdictions in Washtenaw County. This collaborative effort ensures that voters have access to an early voting site and the resources they need to cast their ballots conveniently.

Tax Information

- Summer Collection: 2023 taxes are payable July 1 through September 14 without interest charges. After that date, one percent interest per month will be added to all unpaid tax bills unless a deferment has been granted. Summer tax deferments are available to qualified applicants.
- Winter Collection: 2023 taxes are payable beginning December 1 and are due by February 14, 2024. All 2023 taxes unpaid at the township Treasurer's Office by March 1 must be paid to the Washtenaw County Treasurer with additional interest and penalties as prescribed by law. Winter tax deferments are available to qualified applicants.
- Treasurer's Office Hours: The Township's hours: 8:00 AM to 4:00 PM. Payments can be made in person or through the Treasurer's Mail Slot inside the front foyer of the township hall or mailed. On September 14, 2023, the Treasurer's Office will be open until 5:00 PM. On December 29, 2023, the Treasurer's Office will be open until 5:30 PM and on February 29, 2024, the Treasurer's Office will be open until 5:00 PM. Please refer to the Superior Charter Township Holiday Schedule on our website (www.superiortownship.org) for the days that the Treasurer's Office will be closed.
- Partial Payments: Upon receipt of your tax bill, partial payments in any dollar amount will be accepted; however, any taxes unpaid by the statutory due dates will be subject to applicable interest and penalty fees.
- Mail Payments: Tax payments should be mailed to 3040 N. Prospect Rd., Superior Township, MI, 48198. Please note that postmarks are not accepted and allow for sufficient mailing time.

Wetlands Board Jim McIntyre

Getting ready for autumn means preparing for the annual battle with fallen leaves. Raking leaves is tedious, and always seems like an uphill battle. This year, rather than fighting Mother Nature and raking your leaves, consider mowing your leaves while you mow your grass.

This practice has several benefits. You'll save time and headaches by not raking and bagging your leaves only to then have to find a place to store them while you wait for pickup. The layer of mulch you'll create by mowing your leaves can also help to prevent weeds, as the leaf mulch starves the weed seeds of sunlight, making it harder for them to germinate. That same layer of mulch will help you to conserve water by keeping moisture in the soil, keeping your lawn green with less water.

Additionally, mowing your leaves helps the leaves break down more quickly, adding back nutrients to your lawn. Some experts even argue that this practice can eliminate the need for applying fall fertilizer to your grass, and any fertilizer we can keep out of the watershed has a positive impact on the health of our local wetlands. You can even use any excess leaf mulch to add to your flower beds and gardens to give them a nutrient boost that will make them healthier next year!

Why spend time, effort, and money removing the leaves? Put them to work for you instead by mulching your leaves this fall.

Lots of Construction Happening in Superior Charter Township

The Arbor Hills Animal Clinic at 5347 Plymouth/Ann Arbor Rd. is open for business.

Huron Dental to be located at the corner of Plymouth/Ann Arbor and Church is still in the planning stages.

Woodside Village off Ridge is on pace to be completed in 2024.

Site work has begun for **Prospect Pointe West.** This is a 157-unit development of Single-Family Dwellings by Lombardo Homes. Located just west of Prospect Rd. south of Geddes. The homes will range from 2,000 to 3,200 square ft. Construction is to begin early in 2024, phase one will include 39 homes.

Site preparation has begun for **Kinsley,** a 21-unit project on 47 acres located on the north side of Plymouth rd. west of M-14. Homes here will be from 2,700 to 6,200 square feet on 1 acre lots by Cranbrook Homes. Construction is set to begin in 2024 and expected to wrap up in 2026.

Brookwood Estates is in the preliminary planning stages. This is a 3 phase, 336-unit project located on the east side of Leforge between Geddes and W. Clark. The proposed project is Mixed Use Residential consisting of Apartments, age restricted Duplex's and individually owned Town Homes. They are hoping to start in Fall of 2024.

• **Online Tax Payments:** To pay current year taxes online, visit our website at www.superiortownship.org and click on Departments/Treasurer. There is a \$3.00 fee for Electronic Check payments. The fee will increase to \$10.00 for amounts over \$10,000.00. There is a three (3) percent fee with a minimum \$2.00 fee for credit or debit card payments. VISA, MasterCard, Discover, and American Express are the only credit cards that are accepted online. Fees are charged by the online payment vendor. Tax payments are posted "real time."

• Mailing Address: Tax bills are mailed to the address of record on file as of June 1 and November 1 of each year. Should you not receive your tax bill, please contact the township office to confirm that we have your correct mailing address on file. Per Michigan Statute (MCL 211.44), failure to receive a tax bill does not abate late payments and penalties.

• **Escrow Payments:** Homeowners who have refinanced - please have your lender contact my office with new mailing information.

• **New Homeowners:** Please make sure to complete and file your Principal Residence Exemption (PRE) Affidavit with the Assessor's Office to claim the exemption from the school operating millage.

• **Summer/Winter Tax Deferments:** Qualified applicants may defer payment of their taxes until April 30 without interest or penalties. Please contact the Treasurer's Office at (734) 482-6099 to request an application form if you have not received one by mail. Summer tax deferment applications for the 2023 tax year must be signed and returned by September 14, 2023. Winter tax deferment applications for the 2024 tax year must be signed and returned by February 14, 2024.

EXTENSION for Bill Payment Assistance Program LIHWAP:

The Low Income Household Water Assistance Program (LIHWAP) has been extended. LIHWAP was expected to conclude on September 30th, 2023 but due to an extension, LIHWAP will be continuing until March 31st, 2024! LIHWAP is available for Superior Charter Township residents. Do you know how much water can be lost from a leaky faucet or toilet?

A leaky faucet or toilet can add up very quickly over a short period of time. A very small drip of 30 drops per minute will equal about 54 gallons of water in a one-month period while a slightly larger drip of 60 drops per minute will equal about 237 gallons per month. A leaky toilet can waste about 200 gallons of water every day! To test your toilet, remove the lid from the tank and put in five to ten drops of food coloring. Wait about 30 minutes to check the bowl, if any color seeps in the bowl there is a leak. Have it fixed immediately!

In addition to the amended area plan the Township Board granted Hyundai a 12-year property tax abatement at 50% of the final state equalized value. The total cost of construction is anticipated to be between \$55 million to \$60 million dollars. Hyundai is expected to get their final certificates of occupancy by the end of the year. As a result, the Township will see an increase of approximately \$13 million to \$15 million dollars in taxable value on the tax roll. That will increase total revenues to the township by approximately \$100,000.00 per year beginning in 2024.

At the July 20th meeting the Board voted 5–2 to approve a rezoning and an area plan submitted by the non-profit, Garrett's Space, a proposed facility situated on approximately 70 acres on Dixboro Road just north of M-14. The proposed facility is intended to assist young people between the ages of 18-28 who have suicidal thoughts, depression and/or anxiety. The purpose of the facility is to provide counseling and intervention for these young people. Persons with serious mental illnesses cannot be admitted and the residential capacity is limited to no more than 30 adults.

As a result of the zoning decision, a group of Superior Charter Township residents filed a lawsuit in the Washtenaw County Trial Court seeking to overturn the Township Board's decision to approve the zoning and area plan for this facility.

Despite the lawsuit, Garrett's Space will continue to move through the site plan process. Preliminary and final site plans will have to be submitted, reviewed, and addressed by the Superior Charter Township Planning Commission until a final site plan is approved. Ultimately, Garrett's Space will come back to the Board of Trustees for approval or denial of a final development agreement and plan. So, the issues surrounding Garretts Space are far from finalized. If you have a particular concern one way or another regarding the facility keep your eye on the Township website for updates and the various times for Planning Commission and Township Board review and decisions.

There are also two new housing subdivisions that will begin construction this year. "Prospect Pointe West," located directly west to the Prospect Pointe subdivision will feature 157 new homes. Prospect Pointe West has already started construction of the new public infrastructure to service the houses. To the immediate west of Prospect Pointe West will be a new subdivision, "The Meadows" featuring 215 new homes. Construction should start later this year or early next year.

Price points for these developments are expected to be in the high \$300s to the low \$400 thousand dollars. With the Hyundai expansion and these two new subdivisions, the Utility Department will receive enough revenue to cover the entire cost of the new Clark Road Pump Station plus additional reserves.

The new Clerk Road pump station is under construction and is located on a 55-acre tract of county park land on the north side of Clark Road just west of River Street. As part of the original bid the Township agreed to build a small parking lot and kiosk on the park property to provide access to the preserved parkland. The name of the new park is the "Highlands." After the pump station construction is finished the park will be opened to the public and a trail system will be installed connecting the Highlands to the Township's non-motorized trail system.

Speaking of county parks, the Michigan Folk School is open at the Staebler County Farm Park located on Plymouth-Ann Arbor Road between Prospect and Curtis. The park will host a new facility, the "Blackbird Lodge" which will formally open on October 1st. The new facility has a large meeting room that divides into three smaller rooms for community use. The facility has a complete commercial kitchen for teaching cooking skills.

The Blackbird Lodge is part of the Michigan Folk School's Superior Township campus and rounds out the original Staebler family farmhouse, barns, silos, and outbuildings. The Folk School will provide a range of classes teaching traditional American skills to a modern society.

On October 14th from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m. The Folk School will be hosting the annual "Michigan Folk Festival." Over 30 craft instructors will be teaching and demonstrating traditional skills. There will be music and food. This will be a great time to introduce yourself to this amazing campus of preserved historic buildings, lakes, ponds, crystal clear creeks, forest, and prairie lands.

Election Day Voting Continues

While early voting offers flexibility, traditional voting on Election Day remains unchanged.

Polls will open at 7 a.m. and close at 8 p.m. at your designated voting location.

2024 Election Schedule:

We are waiting on the State's decision regarding the Presidential Primary Election. It will be on one of the following dates:

February 27, 2024 March 12, 2024

August 6, 2024: State Primary Election

November 5, 2024: General Election

Absentee Voting Option:

Michigan also offers the option of absentee voting for any registered voters. You can request and cast your vote by absentee ballot in any election. To make the process even more accessible, registered Michigan voters can sign up for the Permanent Absentee Voter List. By doing so, you will automatically receive an absentee ballot before every election, simplifying the voting process.

To sign up for the Permanent Absentee Voter List, you can visit https://mvic.sos.state.mi.us/ or do so when completing a Michigan Absent Voter Ballot Application by mail or at your local clerk's office. This option ensures that you never miss an opportunity to vote, even if you cannot make it to the polls in person.

In February 2024, an important update will come into effect: voters will have the option to bring their absentee ballots to an early voting site and insert them into a tabulator. This change aims to streamline the early voting process and make it more accessible to Michigan residents. It is critical to note that once any ballot is submitted into a tabulator it cannot be spoiled.

To be clear, Washtenaw County would be the owner of the site development.

OUR SUPERIOR FIRE DEPARTMENT

I am pleased to write this column and update you on what is happening within your Fire Department. With Fall and Winter approaching, it will be time to clean furnaces and wood burning chimneys. Cleaning your furnaces and chimneys helps to prevent fires during the winter months.

Burn Permits

There are limitations to burning within the Township. There are specific restrictions based on where you live in the Township, size of the lot you have, weather conditions, and type of materials to be burned. All details regarding open burning are found in Superior Township Ordinance 185: Burning Ordinance (http://superior-twp-org/news/ ord_185_burning_final.pdf).

The first step is obtaining an application for Open Burning through the Township Clerks Office. Once approved you will need to notify the Fire Department at 734-484-1996, prior to any open burining.

Free Smoke Detectors

The Fire Department has free smoke detector and CO detector to install. You may contact the Fire Department at 734-484-1996 for smoke detector installation.

Power Outages

During the past few months, we have had severe storms causing power outages. We have noticed citizens running portable generators in attached garages. We ask that you please do not run generators in your homes as the generators produce carbon monoxide. This is a deadly gas that is colorless and odorless. The Fire Department has responded to several calls of carbon monoxide incidents during power outages.
