Superior Charter Township Parks & Recreation Commission Regular Meeting January 27, 2025

Proposed Minutes

1. Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 6:30 pm by Chair Nahid Sanii-Yahyai.

2. Roll Call

Park Commissioners present: Nahid Sanii-Yahyai, Greg Vessels, Martha Kern-Boprie, Jack Smiley, Curtis Freeman, Matthew Yahyai

Park Commissioners absent: Sharon Bryant-Phillips

Others present: Juan Bradford, Parks & Recreation Director; Steven Peach, Brenda Baker, Susan LaCroix

3. Flag Salute

Chair Nahid Sanii-Yahyai led those assembled in the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag.

4. Agenda Approval

It was moved by Curtis Freeman and supported by Matthew Yahyai to approve the agenda with the addition of New Business item C. 2025 Special Event Dates. The motion carried.

5. Prior Meeting Minutes Approval

A. December 16, 2024

It was moved by Curtis Freeman and supported by Matthew Yahyai to approve the minutes of 12/16/2025 with the following corrections:

Old Business item A - in the first sentence insert the word "tenants" between the words "requires" and "of" so the sentence reads "Due to current state law that requires tenants of publicly owned property to pay property tax..."

New Business item B – in the seventh WHEREAS statement, correct the spelling of "Natura;" to "Natural".

In the roll call vote on the resolution, correct the spelling of "Sharon Bryan-Phillips" to "Sharon Bryant-Phillips".

The motion carried.

6. Citizen Participation

Susan LaCroix a township resident who lives in a condominium located off the east side of Prospect Road between Clark Road and Berkshire Road requested a non-motorized pathway be constructed along the east side of Prospect between Berkshire and Clark. Presently it is not safe for people to walk along this side of Prospect to access the non-motorized pathway along Clark Road, or the non-motorized pathway that runs north from Berkshire to Geddes Road. Many of her neighbors walk with pets, and others jog and ride bicycles, and it is not safe along this half mile stretch of Prospect. It was noted by Park Commissioners responding to her concern, that installing a non-motorized pathway along this half mile stretch would connect all the other non-motorized pathways into a loop system. Juan Bradford said he would bring this issue to the attention of the township supervisor.

7. Reports

A. Chairperson

Chair Nahid Sanii-Yahyai reported she attended the township board meeting on January 21. TC Collins requested extension of his contract to farm Willow Run Acres (WRA) from 10 years to 15 years. The

extension was needed to allow TC to apply for a grant. The Township Board authorized the extension contingent upon WRA receiving the grant.

B. Director

Juan Bradford submitted a written report. Juan expanded upon the written report with more detail about the tree planting event on April 26 that would be a collaboration with WRA and Washtenaw County Conservation District. This event could also be combined with Kite & Rocket Day. Juan met with representatives of Ypsilanti Little League Baseball about beginning a program in Dixboro on the Village Green. Juan is also working on a parking area for Cherry Hill Nature Preserve (CHNP). The planned parking area would be on the south side of Cherry Hill Road, just east of the entrance to CHNP.

C. Board Liaison

No report. The appointed liaison is Sarah Devereaux, and she was out of town.

D. Board Meeting Attendee

Martha Kern-Boprie attended the December 16, 2024, Township Board meeting as well as Curtis Freeman, Nahid Sanii-Yahyai, Matthew Yahyai and Juan Bradford. Martha submitted a written report on the meeting. Jack Smiley requested that Martha update her text about Citizen Participation to state that Supervisor Emily Dabish Yahkind ruled Irma Golden out of order after two minutes. There were also questions about the dollar amount in Martha's report on Board approval of authorizing Administrative Staff to purchase medical, dental, vision insurance for staff for annual cost up to \$700,000. Martha responded that was the amount she heard during the meeting, but did not have the board packet to refer to.

E. Park Steward

Juan has had no contact with Ellen Kurath.

F. Safety

There were no accidents or injuries in the past month.

It was moved by Martha Kern-Boprie and supported by Greg Vessels to receive the reports. The motion carried.

It was moved by Martha Kern-Boprie and supported by Matthew Yahyai to approve the 2025 Farming Agreement with Steven Peach. A Roll Call vote on the motion was taken.

It was moved by Jack Smiley and supported by Nahid Sanii-Yahyai to appoint Sarah Devereaux to the open seat on the Rock Property Committee. The motion carried.

Juan Bradford conveyed a request from Trustee Sarah Devereaux "Could the Parks & Recreation Commission meet via zoom, or at least permit Sarah to attend via zoom". Sarah travels often for her work, and it is difficult for her to attend in person. After the COVID pandemic subsided, elected governmental bodies have to meet in person. Juan said this is a question for the Park & Recreation Commission to decide. He noted that the Liaison to the Park Commission is paid a stipend for attending, and some park commissioners may resent having to attend in person when the Liaison can attend remotely. Juan also stated the Township Clerk would have to decide if the IT equipment was sufficient to allow the zoom attendee to fully participate. Jack Smiley suggested discussing this question at a future park commission meeting.

- Next Board of Trustees Meeting: Monday, March 17, 2025 @ 7:00pm
- Parks & Recreation Commission Attendee: Commissioner Freeman
- I met with the Washtenaw County Intermediate School District's Regional School Health Coordinator and the Ypsilanti District Library's Youth and Teen Services Librarian last week to coordinate the grant application for the Storybook Walk at Fireman's Park. We will be requesting \$5,000 for the project and should know if we are approved by late March.
- Both the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund Grant, and the Ducks Unlimited Wetland Conservation Grant have moved into the appraisal stage. We have entered into an agreement with the Geral Adcock Company LLC to complete the appraisals. Between Commissioner Smiley and I we have also provided a letter of Due Diligence relating to the environmental condition and history of the property, and documents relating to a 40-year Title Search.
- Last week I met with representatives from Legacy Land Conservancy. They brought to my attention that they are tasked with monitoring a Conservation Easement that the Township holds on a portion of the property where Superior Farm & Garden is located. Together with Legacy we will be ensuring that all conditions of the Conservation Easement are being met. I will keep you updated as we learn more.
- I will be in Grand Traverse March 3rd 6th for the annual MParks Conference. This is a great opportunity to learn about current and rising industry trends, as well as networking with my peers to share program and operations ideas and best practices. Attending this conference allows me to earn Continuing Education Units (CEU's) which are required to maintain my Certified Parks & Recreation Professional status. I will be available by phone, text, and email should something arise that needs my attention.

Subject: Boart Attendee Report on 2/18/2025 Township Board Meeting

Date: February 18, 2025

I attended the Township Board Meeting tonight. In addition to myself, Park Commissioners Nahid Sanii-Yahyai and Mathew Yahyai and Park & Rec Director Juan Bradford attended. All township board members were present.

Public Participation

Several people spoke about Garret's Space. Most speakers advocated moving the process forward, and getting the facility and its services open and functioning. Some suggested the township was creating obstacles to completing Garret's Space. The agenda included discussion of the Conservation Easement and a potential Deed Restriction for Garrett's Space. One speaker did not believe these two options were equal.

Two residents of Warren Road near the intersection with Curtis Road spoke about the poor condition of the road surface of Warren Road as it approaches Curtis. They want the proposed repaving of Curtis Road to extend for 30 feet over Warren Road on either side of Curtis, as they believe this will resolve problems on Warren Road.

Another speaker noted the township board has undertaken improvements to its appointment process for filling boards and commissions, but does not find the board has followed through on this process in recent appointments.

Supervisor's Comments

Supervisor Emily Dabish Yahkind stated she is seeking to follow through on completion of Garret's Space without obstructions or barriers.

Supervisor's Report

Supervisor Dabish Yahkind reported she has been working with Sycamore Meadows and Danbury Park Manor, federal agencies that regulate and fund this housing and other stakeholders to improve conditions in these residences.

The agenda was amended to add the resignation of Keith Lockie from the Controller position. The resignation arrived via email shortly before the meeting.

Unfinished Business

- A. Ord 159 amending Danbury Park Manor Tax Exemption second reading: approved
- B. Approved Appointments to the Board of Review Approved on 5 Yes to 2 No vote. Trustee Dana Greene and Clerk Angela Robinson voted no.

New Business

- A. Seven resolutions that were approved at previous board meetings had to be given new resolution numbers and then re-approved. They were all re-approved in one motion.
- B. Discussion regarding Garret's Space Conservation Easement and a possible Deed Restriction. Fred Lucas, attorney for Superior Twp and the attorney for Garret's Space addressed the board on this issue. Mr. Lucas stated the Conservation Easement would have three parties: the Twp, Garret's Space and a third party to monitor and regulate any attempt to violate the easement. A Deed Restriction would be held by the twp., could give the twp. more power and be completed faster. A Conservation Easement could take longer to complete. It was noted the Deed Restriction could be put in place now, and the Conservation Easement completed later. The founder of Garret's Space spoke and asked if this would delay completion of Garret's Space. Attorney Lucas noted that the Conservation Easement would be needed before a Certificate of Occupancy was issued for the new building to be constructed, but the construction period is estimated to be 18 months, and the Conservation Easement could be prepared during that period. The easement is not needed to begin construction work. The Twp Board voted to approve the Deed Restriction on a 7 to 0 vote.

- C. Resolution 2025-07 to approve Superior Twp appointment to Planning Commission approved 7 0
- D. Resolution 2025-08 to approve amended Lease Agreement Superior Twp Parks & Rec Commission and Willow Run Acres regarding Clay Hill Community Farm & Garden approved 7 0
- E. Resolution 2025-09 to approve purchase of laptop computers for voting precincts. Expense will be reimbursed to the twp. Approved 7-0
- F. Resolution 2025-10 to approve the agreement for Rental Housing Certification Consulting Services. This was a proposal to have this consultant inspect rental housing units, identify needed corrections, and then certify the units once standards are met. The cost of the service will be borne by the landlord, who passes it on to the tenant. It does increase the cost of rental housing, but can help ensure safer, higher quality rental housing. Approved 7 0
- G. Resolution 2025-11 to permit the Michigan Dept of Natural Resources (MDNR) to proceed with a public hearing and investigate the need for prescribed hunting and firearms control in Superior Twp Approved 7 -0
- H. Resolution 2025-12 to accept bid with PPM Tree Service and Arbor Care, LLC for removal of trees on Geddes Road between Andover and Wexford for future non-motorized pathway construction. Clerk Robinson noted these were quotes not formal bids. She reported that the time deadlines for the grant that would cover most of the cost of the tree removal necessitated using quotes instead of a formal bid process. Approved 7 0
- I. Accept resignation of Keith Lockie from position of Controller. Clerk Robinson read the email from Keith Lockie that arrived today, in which he resigned from the position of Controller but wished to retain his position as bookkeeper in the Utility Dept. The Utility Dept position is paid on an hourly basis. Keith also said he would be available to help with the audit of 2024 business. Extensive discussion took place about the work Keith does now, and proposes to do, whether it was appropriate or not. Nancy Mason was present and reported she handles all funds except the Utility Dept. The board voted to accept his resignation, but it was not clear to me all the terms of that approval.

Bills were approved

Pleas and Petitions

Rhonda McGill noted that Keith Lockie resigned 5 times during her four years on the Twp Board. She urged the board to find a controller who <u>wants</u> to be here.

Trustee Brenda McKinney thanked Treasurer Lewis for continuing the Blanket Express drive in December and asked where the blankets were sent. Treasurer Lewis responded the Delonis Homeless Center in Ann Arbor received them, and some went to the overnight shelter on Saturday and Sunday nights at Second Baptist Church in Ypsilanti. I reported that my church St. Luke's Episcopal in Ypsilanti hosts the overnight shelter on Monday through Friday nights.

Kelly Goolsby sent in a plea online that she wants the Twp Board held responsible for conditions in Sycamore Meadows and Danbury Park Manor.

The meeting adjourned at 9:05 pm.





Requests for quotes were solicited for a new, model year 2025, 4WD, half-ton, pickup truck. This truck will be used by the Parks Maintenance staff for their daily duties, which will include towing a 20-foot-long landscape trailer and mowers.

The new vehicle will replace a 2001 Dodge 4WD, half-ton pickup truck that is in very poor condition. The anti-lock brake system is failing and is non-repairable due to replacement parts no longer being produced and this truck also lacks air conditioning, both of these are issues that fail to provide a safe environment for our staff. The body and the bed are both rusting out, which indicates that the frame will soon follow.

The 2025 Parks & Recreation Budget which was approved by the Commission, and Board of Trustees, contained an appropriation from the Parks & Recreation Reserve Fund Balance of \$85,000 to be used for the purchase of Equipment Over \$5,000. Specifically, \$50,000 for a 2025 4WD pickup truck and \$35,000 for a 4WD Toro mower.

The approximate retail value of the proposed truck as reflected in the attached window sticker is \$53,3000. The prices quoted below are based on both the State of Michigan MiDeal program which provides pricing for state approved fleet sales, and individual dealer provided fleet pricing discounts.
