

Superior Township Parks

Community Park is located on Stamford Road, across from the old Cheney Elementary School. Ten acres are open, eight are wooded; the park includes a ball field, play equipment, and a tennis court.



Oakbrook Park, on the south side of Berkshire Road, between Sheffield and Stamford, has a picnic area, a drinking fountain, play equipment, a ball field, and an open field for other activities.



Fireman's Park is a neighborhood park at the corner of MacArthur Boulevard and Harris Road. It has access to

the library and its restrooms, with a parking lot and field for special events.

North Prospect Park, just north of Fire Station 1, in the northern part of the Township, is an undeveloped passive use park used mostly by bird watchers and dog walkers.



Harvest Moon Park is located east of Wiard Road, with main access from Harvest Lane. The neighborhood park has a shaded picnic area, a play structure, and a basketball court.



Schock Park, located next to the Township Hall, is a pleasant grassy space that includes a picnic area. It is the site of the restored Old Township Hall; the Township Parks and Recreation maintenance crew also has its headquarters there.



Norfolk Park, on Norfolk Avenue between Sheffield and Stamford, is a small neighborhood park with a shelter and open space. Wooded trails connect to adjoining Oakbrook Park.



Schroeter Park is located at the southeast corner of Berry and Warren Roads. The regional park is an undeveloped natural area used mainly by horseback riders, walkers and cross-country skiers, and abuts the Weatherbee Woods Preserve of Washtenaw County Parks.
